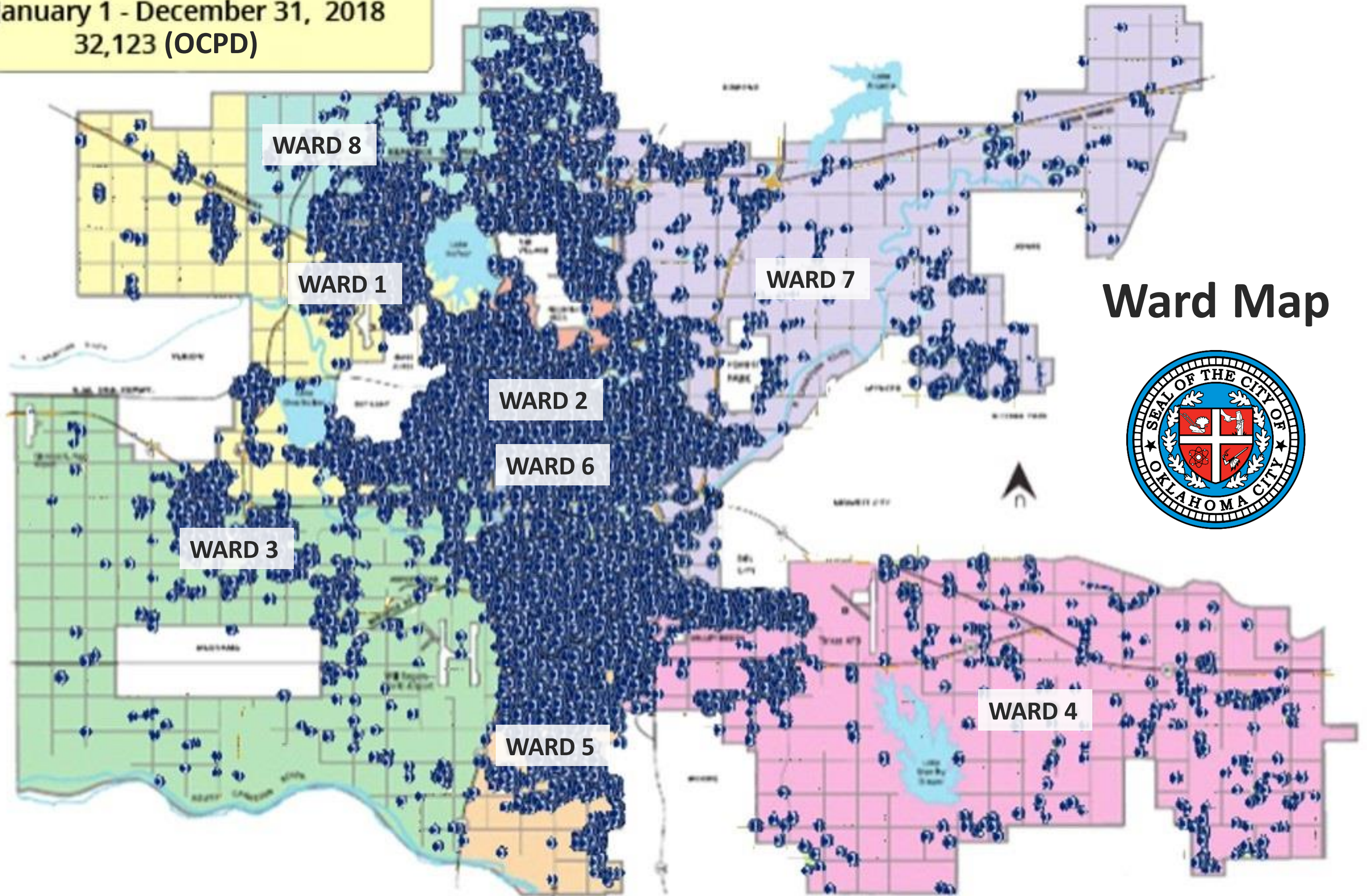

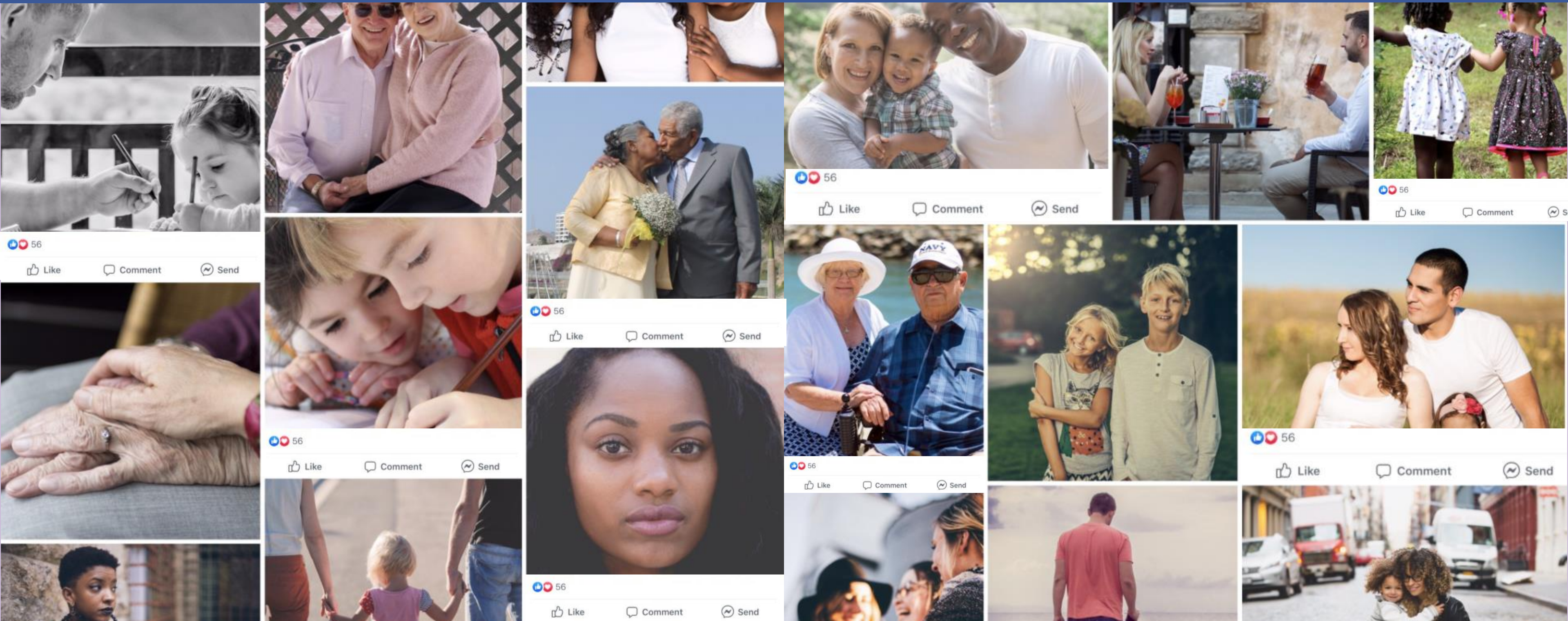
EVERY NEIGHBORHOOD

OUR VISION

Create a COMMUNITY HEALING AND RESTORATION CENTER where more than 45 agencies collaborate to support and empower survivors, and their children who have experienced violence, abuse and trauma.

OUR NEED

- Our current facility is *temporary*.
- Client numbers are increasing, and we are outgrowing our building.
- Our partners have more needs than our space can accommodate.

OUR PROPOSAL

Co-locate and expand comprehensive services including:

- 24-hour assistance
- Therapy & trauma treatment
- Acute medical services
- Comprehensive child services
- Conference rooms and event space for education, speakers & meetings
- Job training, food pantry & other wrap around services

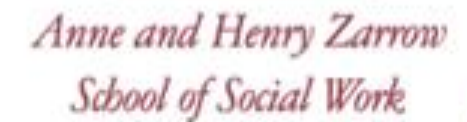


Palomar brings agencies together who provide healthcare, housing, police, legal help, mental health, advocacy and more.

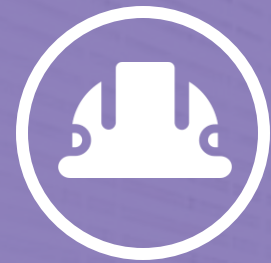

OUR COLLECTIVE IMPACT



INCREASED SAFETY

- Increase 37% state charged filed in Oklahoma County
- 8.4% reduction in domestic related calls to 911 (2018)
- Increased federal prosecution = more violent offenders off the street
 - “Gold Standard” – U.S. Dept. of Justice



IMPROVED OUTCOMES

- Average client satisfaction rate is 90%
- Statewide training on strangulation which changed medical protocols for treatment
- Rapid Response High Risk Team



REDUCED TRAUMA

- “What used to take 7 weeks now takes 7 minutes.”
-Sara Wray, Former YWCA Advocate
- Increased collaboration among 30 agencies
- Developed new court filing tech with Legal Aid to increase efficiency and improve court experience



INTERRUPTED CYCLES

- Kid’s programming (Camp HOPE, HALO)
- Early intervention (YWCA, Pivot)
- Keeping children with the non-offending parent to reduce subsequent trauma

UNDOING THE DAMAGE

The toll of traumatic experience is devastating and can impact a person throughout their lifetime.

Those who experience abuse suffer from:

- lower achievement in school and work
- higher risk of abusing drugs and alcohol
- chronic health conditions
- early death

HELPING VICTIMS GET THEIR LIVES BACK



CRISIS INTERVENTION IS
JUST STEP ONE.

Providing necessities like food, shelter, transportation and a job are only part of what these individuals need.



TO HEAL OUR COMMUNITY, WE'RE
TREATING THE UNDERLYING CAUSE &
BREAKING THE CYCLE.

Oftentimes abusers are created as a result of seeing abuse in their early childhood years. Intense trauma therapy, education, coping skills and modeling healthy relationships will keep the next generation from repeating the same behaviors.

THE COST TO THE COMMUNITY

Law Enforcement	Serving VPO, 911 calls, officer patrol visits, etc.	\$2,262.23
Mental Health	Therapy, substance abuse treatment, psych evaluation, etc.	\$9,050.00
Family	Foster care, child therapy, parenting classes, etc.	\$23,026.00
Other	Loss of income, transportation, food stamps, insurance, etc.	\$42,650.00

THERAPY & HEALING CENTER

Our most requested service is therapy. To support their family's long-term needs partners will provide:

- Art and play therapy
- Psychiatry
- Substance abuse
- Grief and loss
- Individual and group treatment
- Peer support

COMPREHENSIVE CHILD SERVICES

Many of our clients walk through our doors with children in tow. Partners will provide:

- Daycare and drop-in
- Therapy
- Wellness exams
- Forensic interviews
- Support groups
- Parental support

ANIMAL ADVOCACY

Pets are a significant barrier for clients to leave an abusive situation. Animal Advocacy will provide clients:

- Safety planning'
- Coordinate emergency vet care
- On-site kenneling
- Foster care
- Dog park



CHAPEL & FAITH-BASED SERVICES

The demand for faith-based services is significant. We envision a chapel and robust multi-denominational Chaplaincy program to meet client's faith-based and spiritual needs.



INTEGRATED MEDICAL SERVICES

Immediate and long-term healthcare options are critical. Partners will provide:

- Pharmacy
- Lab
- Forensics
- Medical clinic



SECURE & WELCOMING SERVICES

Since opening, we've had 23,931 client visits. Clients need safe space to work through their trauma and partner agencies need office space to collaborate.



TRAINING CENTER

We've hosted over 100 education events. We envision a space large enough to:

- Host conferences
- Educational seminars
- Community classes
- Simulation lab
- University classes
- Community events

GENERATIONAL DAMAGE



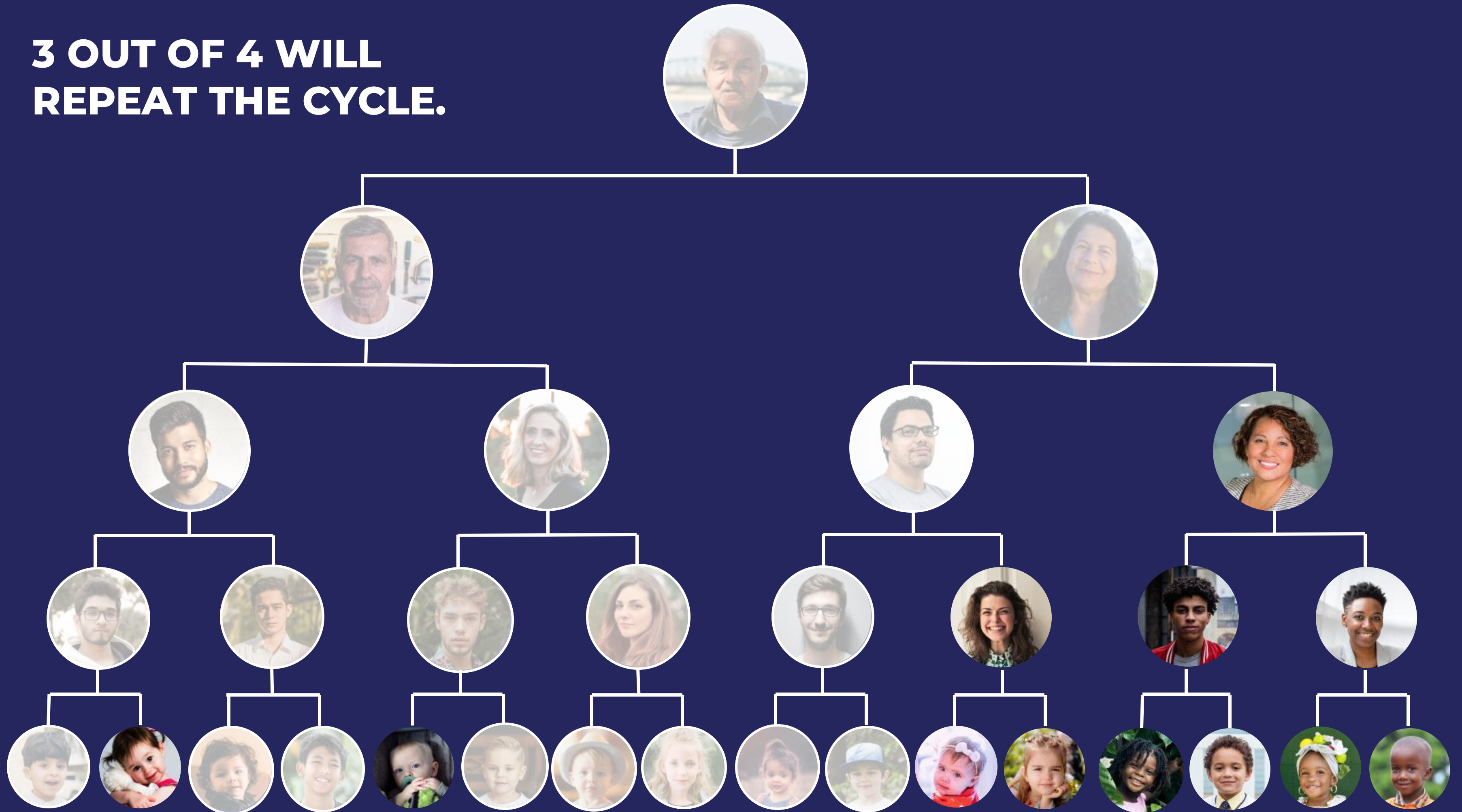
78% of all domestic abuse calls have children in the home. (OCPD, 2015)

WITHOUT INTERVENTION:

75% of children who witness domestic violence will grow up to repeat the same behavior. (Crime Victims Inst., 2013)
