#### Financial Highlights

The Oklahoma City Economic Development Trust borrowed \$67,355,000 through TIF #2 Tax Increment Revenue Bonds in January 2018 in order to repay the Trust's 2008 Private Placement Tax Anticipation Note with a balance of \$25,000,000 and the Trust's 2014 Private Placement Tax Anticipation note that was being utilized as a line of credit with a balance of \$17,830,430. The remaining bond proceeds of \$26,340,707.40 after issuance costs shall be used for future project costs. The unaudited financials for the period ending April 30, 2020 are attached. The projected increment for FY20 is \$15,162,367.

RESOLUTION OF THE DOWNTOWN/MAPS TAX INCREMENT **DISTRICT** REVIEW COMMITTEE RECOMMENDING APPROVAL OF THE PROPOSED MINOR AMENDMENT TO THE DOWNTOWN/MAPS **ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT PROJECT** AMENDING THE SECTION TITLED: "ESTIMATED PROJECT COSTS" BY ADJUSTING CERTAIN BUDGET LINE ITEMS FOR INCREMENT DISTRICT NUMBER EIGHT, CITY OF OKLAHOMA CITY, WHICH AMENDMENTS WILL RESULT IN A NET ZERO CHANGE TO THE TOTAL PROJECT COSTS FOR INCREMENT DISTRICT NUMBER EIGHT.

WHEREAS, on March 7, 2000, The City of Oklahoma City ("City") adopted Ordinance No. 21,431, approving the Downtown/MAPS Economic Development Project Plan, which has been amended from time to time, most recently on November 20, 2018 by Ordinance 26,084 (the "Project Plan"); and

WHEREAS, the Project Plan as adopted and amended, established several Increment Districts including Increment District Number Eight, City of Oklahoma City, ("Increment District No. 8) and a Project Area, wherein increment generated in the established Increment Districts can be spent per the applicable provisions of the Local Development Act, 62 Okla.Stat. § 801, et seq. (the "Local Development Act"); and

WHEREAS, the Project Plan, as amended from time to time, requires that the Downtown/MAPS Tax Increment Review Committee ("Review Committee") review any proposed amendments to the Project Plan in light of the Project Plan's stated objectives, feasibility, priorities, and funding availability and submit its recommendation to the City Council of The City of Oklahoma City ("City Council") and the Oklahoma City Economic Development Trust ("OCEDT" or "Trust"); and

WHEREAS, the Project Plan, as required by the Local Development Act, provided for and established a Review Committee comprised of representatives of each of the taxing jurisdictions located within the boundaries of the Increment District from which the increment is generated, as well as the required representatives of the public at large; and

WHEREAS, The City of Oklahoma City ("City") and OCEDT, the City's designated administrator of the Project Plan, desire to promote and assist economic development and community development projects which involve substantial investments in the Project Area and which support tourism opportunities throughout the City; and

WHEREAS, the Local Development Act provides at 62 O.S. § 858(D):

The governing body may grant the department, agency or public entity in charge of the implementation of the project plan the authority to make minor amendments to the plan. An amendment is considered to be minor if such amendment does not change the character or purpose of the plan; does not add more than five percent (5%) to the district's area; or does not add more than five percent (5%) to the public costs of the plan to be financed by apportioned tax increments. All amendments made pursuant to the provisions of this subsection shall be considered on a cumulative basis.

WHEREAS, the Review Committee has received information from City staff regarding a proposed "minor amendment" (as defined under the Local Development Act) to the Project Plan in regard to Increment District No. 8, by amending line items in the Increment District No. 8's budget, which amendment results in a net zero change to the total budget; and

WHEREAS, the proposed amendment makes no change to the character or purpose of the Project Plan, makes no changes to Increment District No. 8's increment area, nor does it add more than five (5%) percent to the public costs of the plan to be financed by apportioned tax increments, and therefore should be considered a minor amendment to plan as defined in the Local Development Act; and

WHEREAS, City Staff proposes that the "ESTIMATED PROJECT COSTS" for Increment District No. 8 be amended to read as follows:

Plus interest and costs of issuance of bonds to finance the authorized project activities, and in addition thereto, general administrative costs in an amount up to 5% of the annual tax increment revenues.

"Other Economic Developments" as used in Increment District Number Eight are herein defined as projects that promote job growth and new investment in the Project Area through the creation of new jobs in Oklahoma and/or the relocation of existing Oklahoma-based jobs into the Project Area or to support the development of the Omni Convention Center Hotel, all in an effort to further enhance and develop the Project Area.

Authorized project costs include, but are not limited in any manner, assistance in development financing and any capital costs including reimbursement of capital investment or expenditures made by a respective company, developer, or tenant in the alteration, remodeling, repair, or reconstruction of existing public or private buildings, structures, and fixtures.

WHEREAS, the purpose of the Project Plan is to stimulate a combination of public and private redevelopment investment to match or exceed the investment of the City in the MAPS program, giving priority to investment activities which bring residents and visitors to the Downtown/MAPS Project Area, in order to revitalize downtown Oklahoma City; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of the proposed amendment to Increment District No. 8 is to strengthen the ability of the Project Plan to achieve its development objectives, which were previously approved in accordance with 62 O.S. § 858; and

WHEREAS, it is appropriate and desirable to amend the estimated budget for Increment District No. 8 as recommended by City staff; and

WHEREAS, the Review Committee finds it appropriate and desirable to recommend that the Oklahoma City Economic Development Trust adopt a minor amendment to the Project Plan as authorized under 62 Okla.Stat. § 858(D) to reflect a change in the Estimated Project Costs for Increment District No. 8 as shown above.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Downtown/MAPS Tax Increment District Review Committee that:

1. The Review Committee hereby recommends that the Oklahoma City Economic Development Trust be authorized to and directed to make minor amendments to the Project Plan by revising the Estimated Project Costs for Increment District No. 8 to reflect a \$2,000,000 decrease to Other Economic Developments Costs, and a corresponding increase of \$2,000,000 to Redevelopment Framework Costs.
