Will Rogers Park

Martin Park

More than just a park, Martin Park Nature Center is a hub for nature exploration and education for visitors of all ages. Martin Park offers visitors the opportunity to disconnect from their fast-paced lives and relax in a natural environment. Located in the Cross-Timbers region of Oklahoma, Martin Park is an urban hotspot for migratory birds, deer, turtles, coyotes, reptiles, amphibians and insects. Martin Park is open year-round to the public and offers a variety of programs and classes for youth, family, and adults.

Wiley Post Park

Wiley Post Park sits right along the Oklahoma River and was named after the famous Oklahoma pilot that circumnavigated the globe in 1931.

The park offers river trails, open fields, a popular playground, splashpad, outdoor fitness court and an outdoor pavilion with its very own sand volleyball court.

The park is located just across the street from the Mat Hoffman Action Sports park, the biggest skate park in the city.
