TERMINATION OF PROCLAMATION OF STATE OF EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, on May 30 and 31, 2020, peaceful protests were held, and some participants moved from the original protest location to the streets adjacent to the Oklahoma City Police Department Headquarters located at 700 Colcord Drive; and

WHEREAS, during both nights public disorder broke out with objects being thrown, property vandalized and broken; and

WHEREAS, on May 31, 2020, pursuant to Section 15-37 of the Oklahoma City Municipal Code, I declared a State of Emergency and put three regulations in place: 1) a curfew; 2) prohibition on Molotov cocktails or explosives; and 3) prohibition of flammables; and

WHEREAS, on June 1, 2020, peaceful protests were held without incidents of violence or destruction; and

WHEREAS, Section 15-37 provides, the state of emergency shall continue until the issuance of a proclamation of the Mayor declaring its termination and the Mayor shall terminate the proclamation when order has been restored in the area affected; and


WHEREAS, I have determined that with the peaceful acts of the protestors this past day, order has been restored and the May 31, 2020 Proclamation should be terminated.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED, as the Mayor of The City of Oklahoma City I declare the state of emergency and the prohibitions of the May 31, 2020 Proclamation to be terminated.

AND I DO FURTHER PROCLAIM, that public notice of this termination of proclamation and state of emergency shall be given to and filed with the City Clerk of The City of Oklahoma City.


