




#### **COVID-19 Oklahoma City Cases and Deaths Per Day**





















## **COVID-19** Cases and Deaths by Race and Ethnicity








### **COVID-19 Case Status Statewide**





#### Initial Claims

Unemployment claims are reported on a weekly basis every Thursday by the U.S. Department of Labor.


*New data published 7/23/2020:* 

- *Reported 8,579 initial claims filed in Oklahoma during the week ending 7/18/2020*
- *Revised upwards by 1,059 claims filed during the week ending 7/11/2020*

Each of these numbers represents the number of new unemployment claims filed in Oklahoma each week; they are **not** cumulative. When weekly data is released, prior week data is subject to revision by the U.S. Department of Labor.

The data used here is not seasonally adjusted.





Note: Oklahoma's unemployment system has seen a large but still unclear quantity of fraudulent claims. The Oklahoma Employment Security Commission (OESC) and their benefits distribution contractor were reported to have "<u>identified about 70,000 claims as</u> <u>being fraudulent</u>." On Monday, June 22<sup>nd</sup>, the OESC interim director stated since March 1<sup>st</sup>, "<u>about 64,000 claims</u>," or about 10% of all claims statewide, were identified as potential fraud and stopped; prior stories reported "<u>100,000 have been viewed as</u> <u>fraudulent</u>" with "<u>nearly 15,000 fictitious claims</u>" linked to "<u>a well-organized Nigerian fraud ring</u>." The Oklahoma Employment Security Commission <u>has set-up a website</u> solely for the purpose of intaking reports of unemployment fraud.
