CAREER TRAINING & FINANCIAL HELP

Do you need training in a new career field because you lost your job during the pandemic? Are you behind on your bills or worried about eviction because of COVID-19? Community CARES Partners can help. It's a public-private resource center that helps Oklahoma City residents affected by COVID-19 pay rent, utilities and other bills, or get training to start a new career. If you lost your job or income after March 1 because of COVID-19, are behind on your rent, electric, water or gas bills, and live in the Oklahoma City limits, you might qualify. Apply online at okcommunitycares.org or call 211. The application process takes five minutes. Be ready to provide proof you lost your job or are behind on bills, like an eviction notice, unemployment documents, court summons, past due bills or cutoff notices. If you're facing eviction, be sure to show up to your court date. Lawyers from Legal Aid Services will be there to help for free.

Toss the FOG

Don't let a clogged sewer line ruin your holiday. Never pour fats, oils and grease (FOG) down the drain. Here are ways to dispose of FOG:

- Pour cooled cooking oil into a can, bottle or plastic bag. Throw it away.
- Wipe out pots and pans before washing.
- Pour FOG into a can and put it in the freezer. Throw it away once it's full.
- Fill up a can and bring it to Household Hazardous Waste: 1621 S Portland Ave., Tues.-Fri. 9:30 a.m.-6 p.m. , Sat. 8:30-11 a.m.

Mobility management

EMBARK has expanded essential transportation services for seniors and people with disabilities to help them safely shelter in place during the pandemic. Applicants age 60 and up and people with disabilities can use EMBARK's Mobility Management Service for access to necessities and medical care. Text to 911

You can now send a text message to 911 for emergency services in Oklahoma City. It's always best to call if you can, but text if you can't. Open up a new text message, enter 911 as the recipient, and send a short message with the location and the type of emergency. The service is to help people with hearing or speech impairments, or in situations where a voice call is unsafe or impossible. The service is available throughout Oklahoma, Cleveland, Canadian and Logan counties in partnership with the Association of Central Oklahoma Governments. Visit acogok.org/text911 for details.

Contact the Public Works Department for flood information from our community's Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM), including whether a property is in a special flood hazard area or floodway, historical flood information, flood depth data, special flood-related hazards, natural floodplain functions, problems not shown on the FIRM and more. Copies of FEMA elevation certificates of structures built in the floodplain after April 2013 are also available upon request. Call (405) 297-2581 for details.
