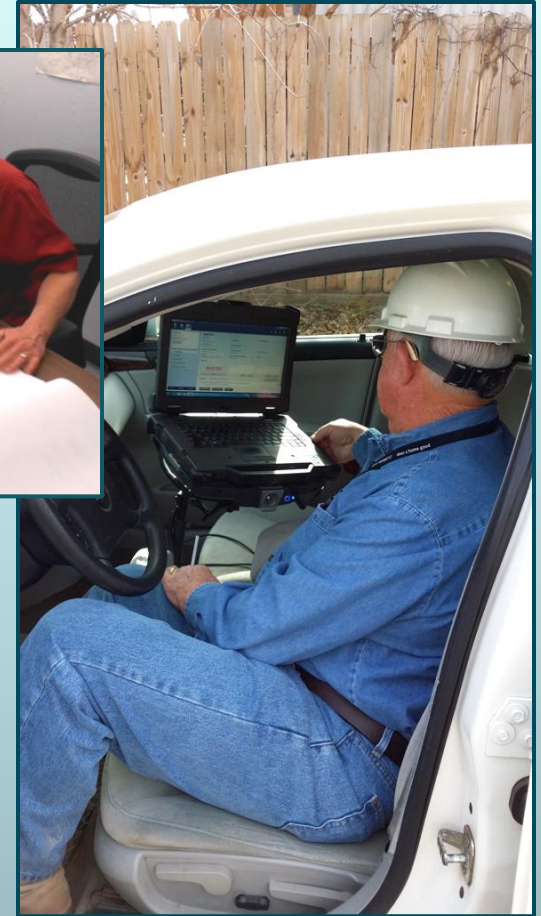

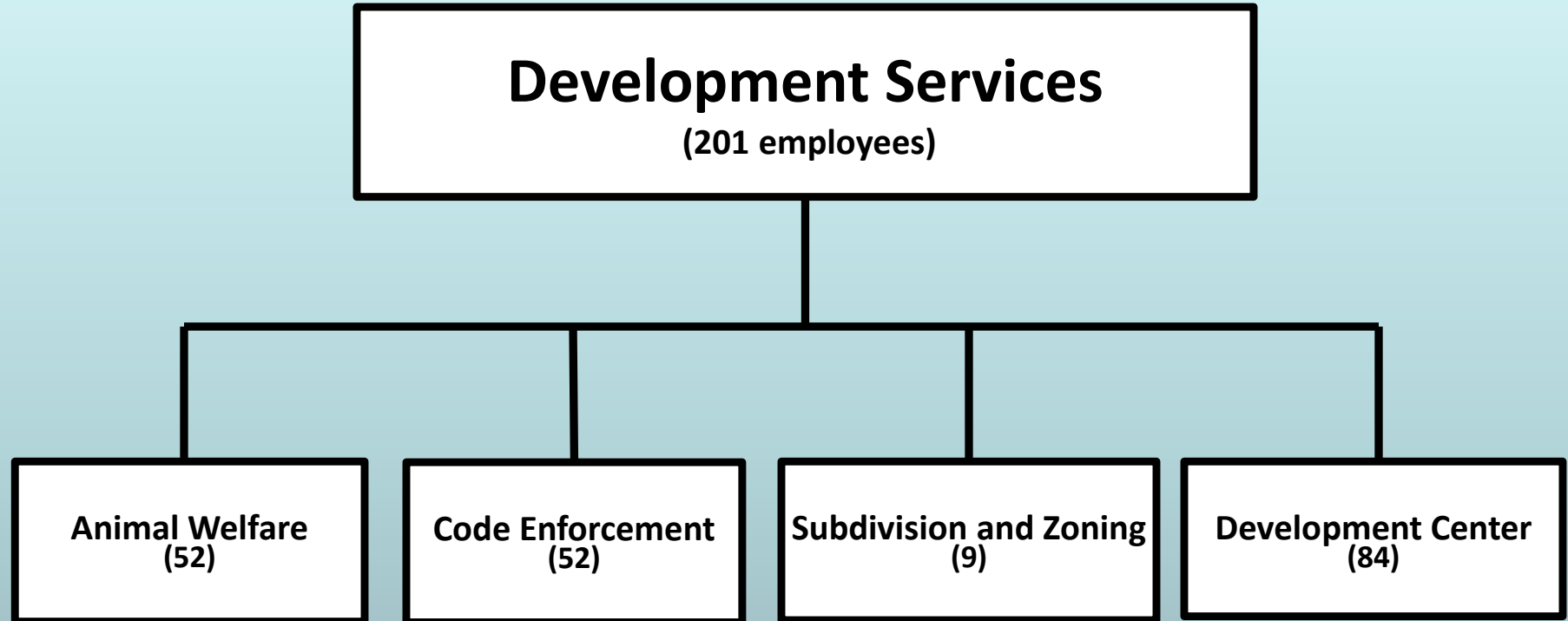


Proposed 2015-2016 Budget

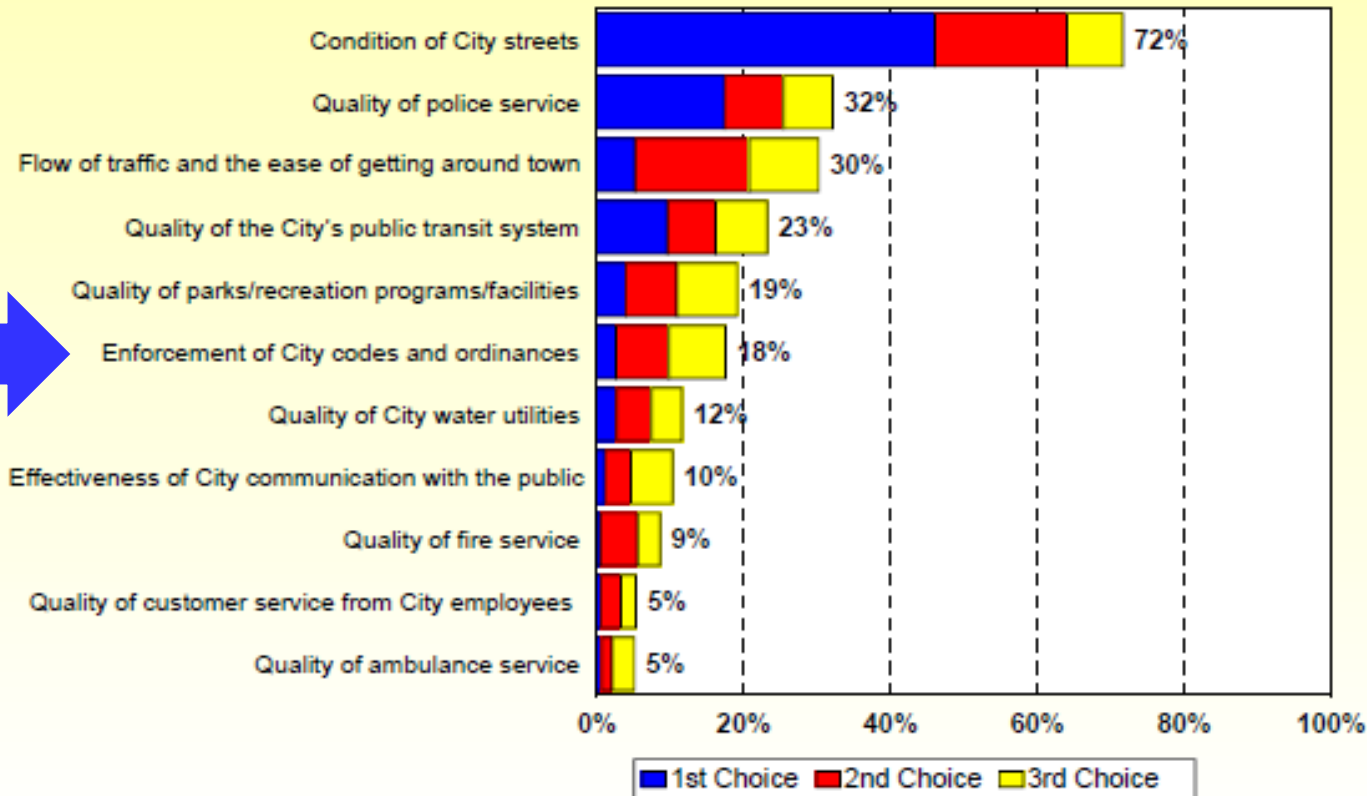
ORGANIZATIONAL CHART

by percentage of respondents who selected the item as one of their top three choices



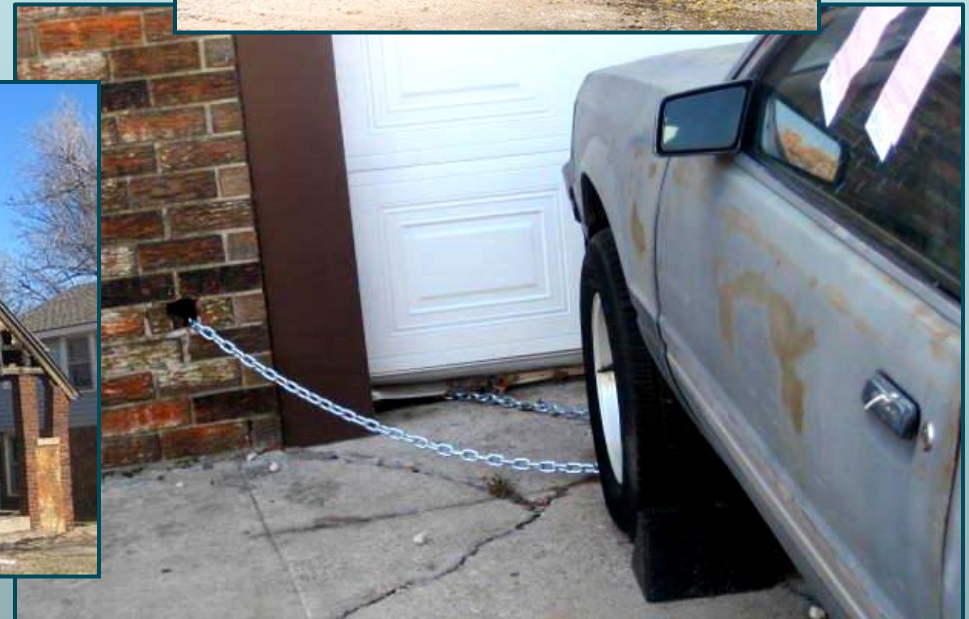

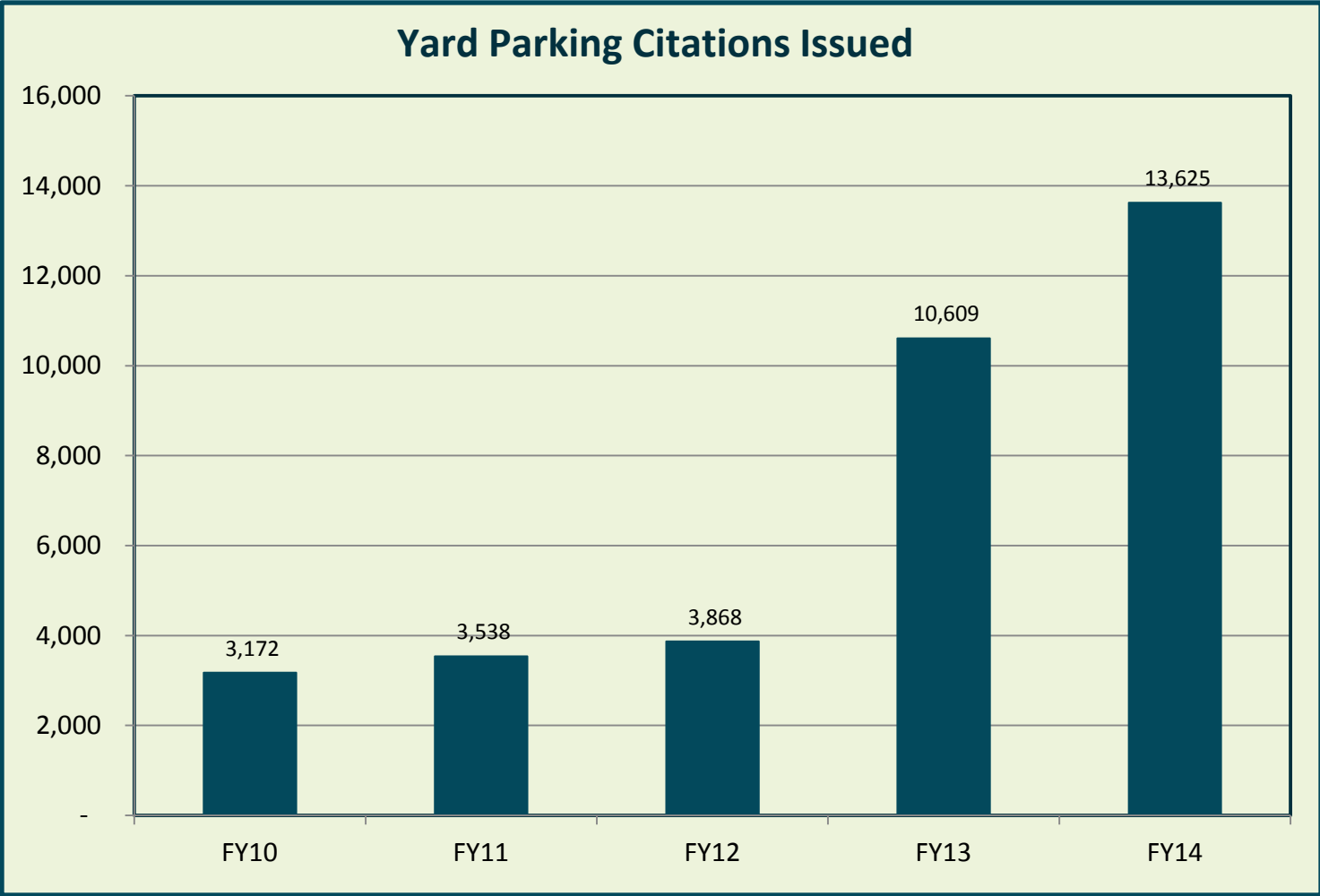

- Issues 16,000 citations



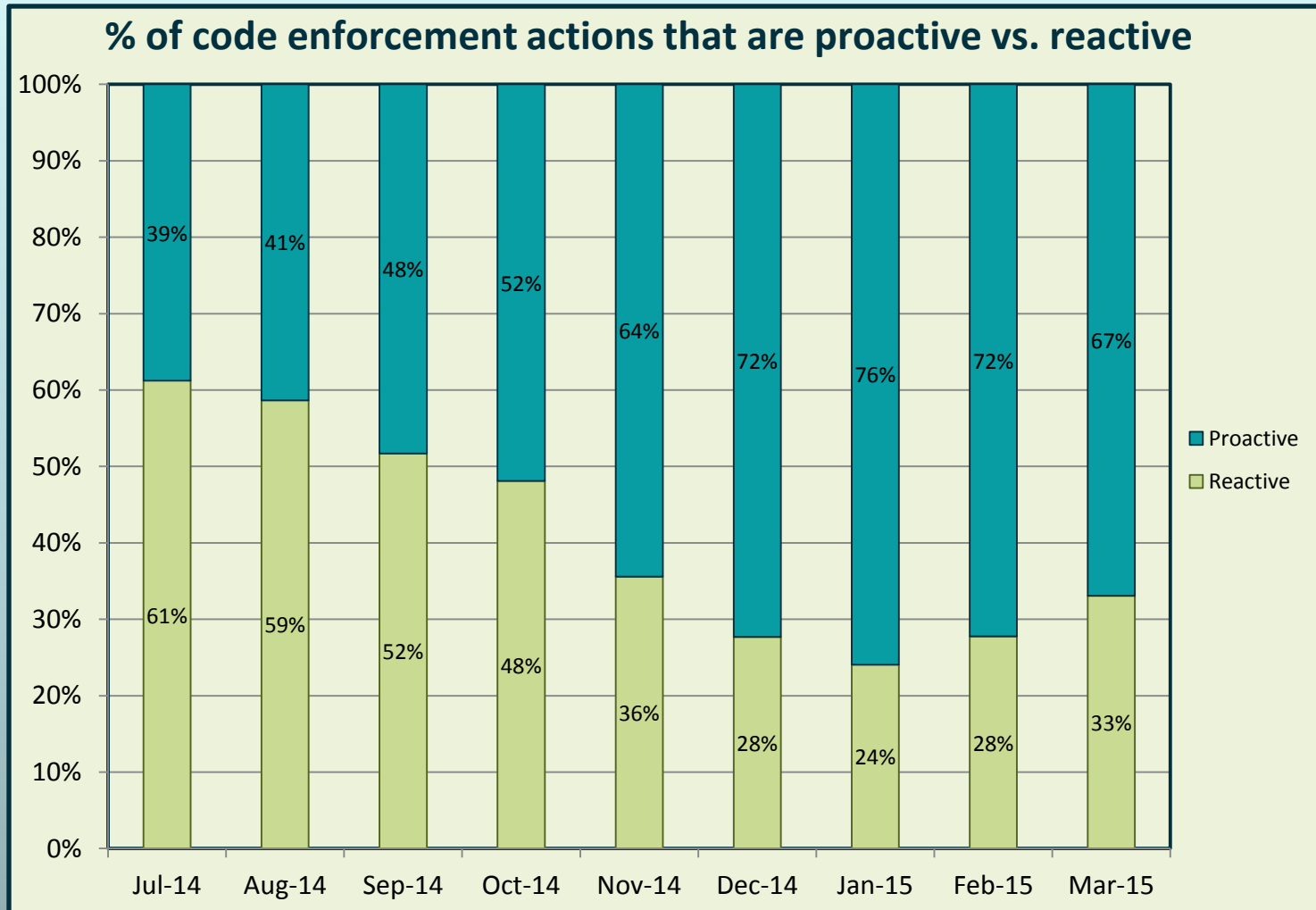

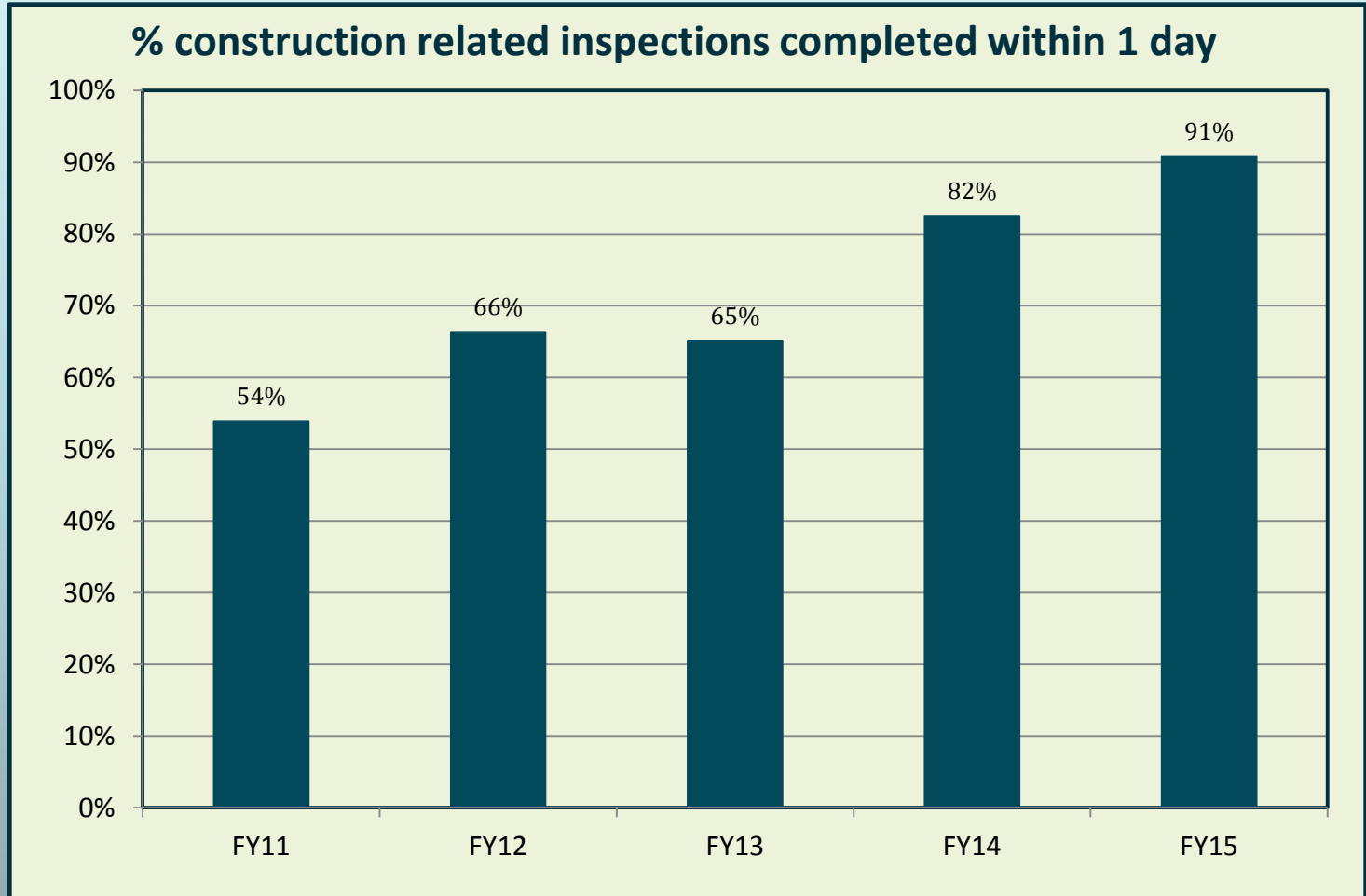
- Completes 111,000 inspections

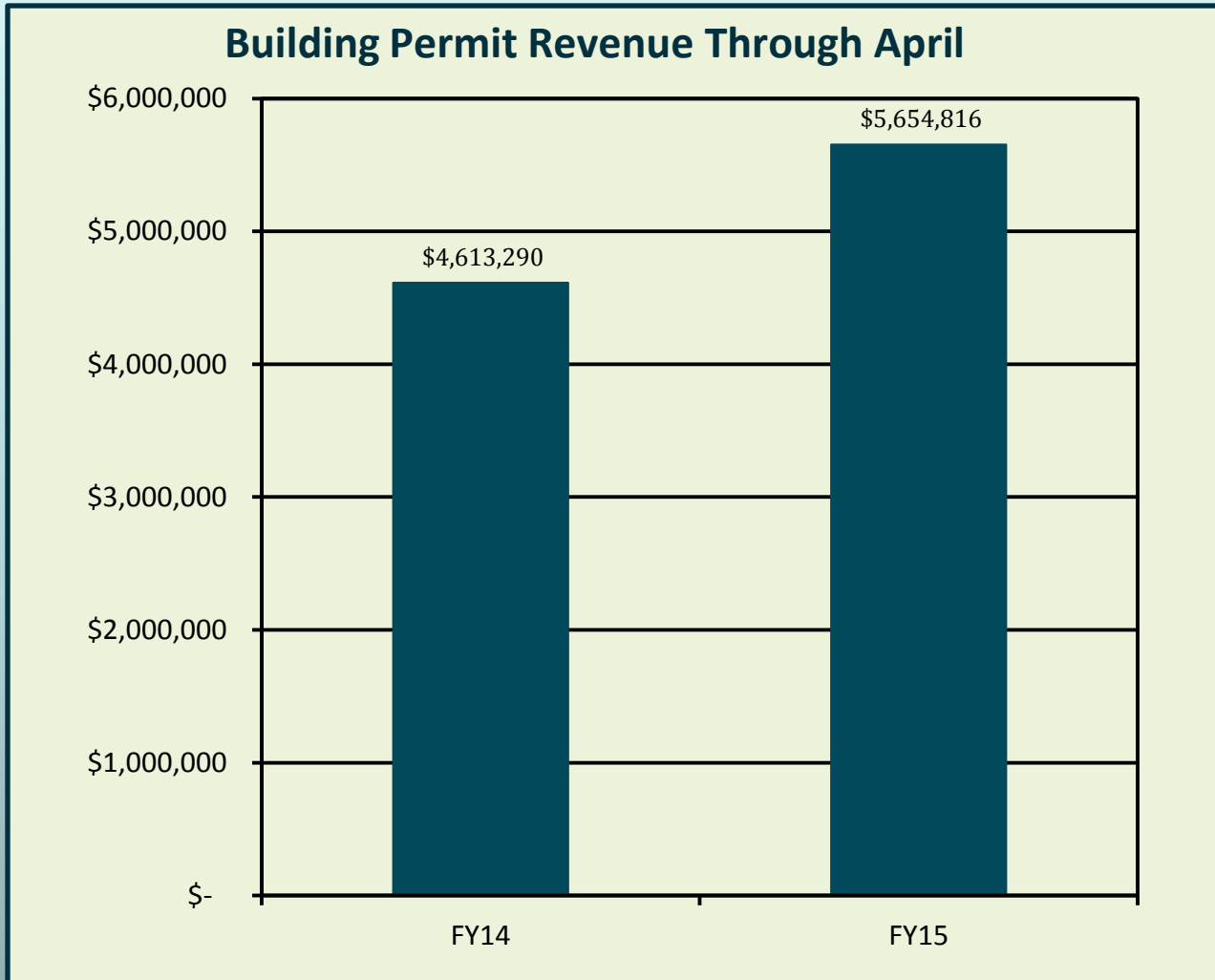

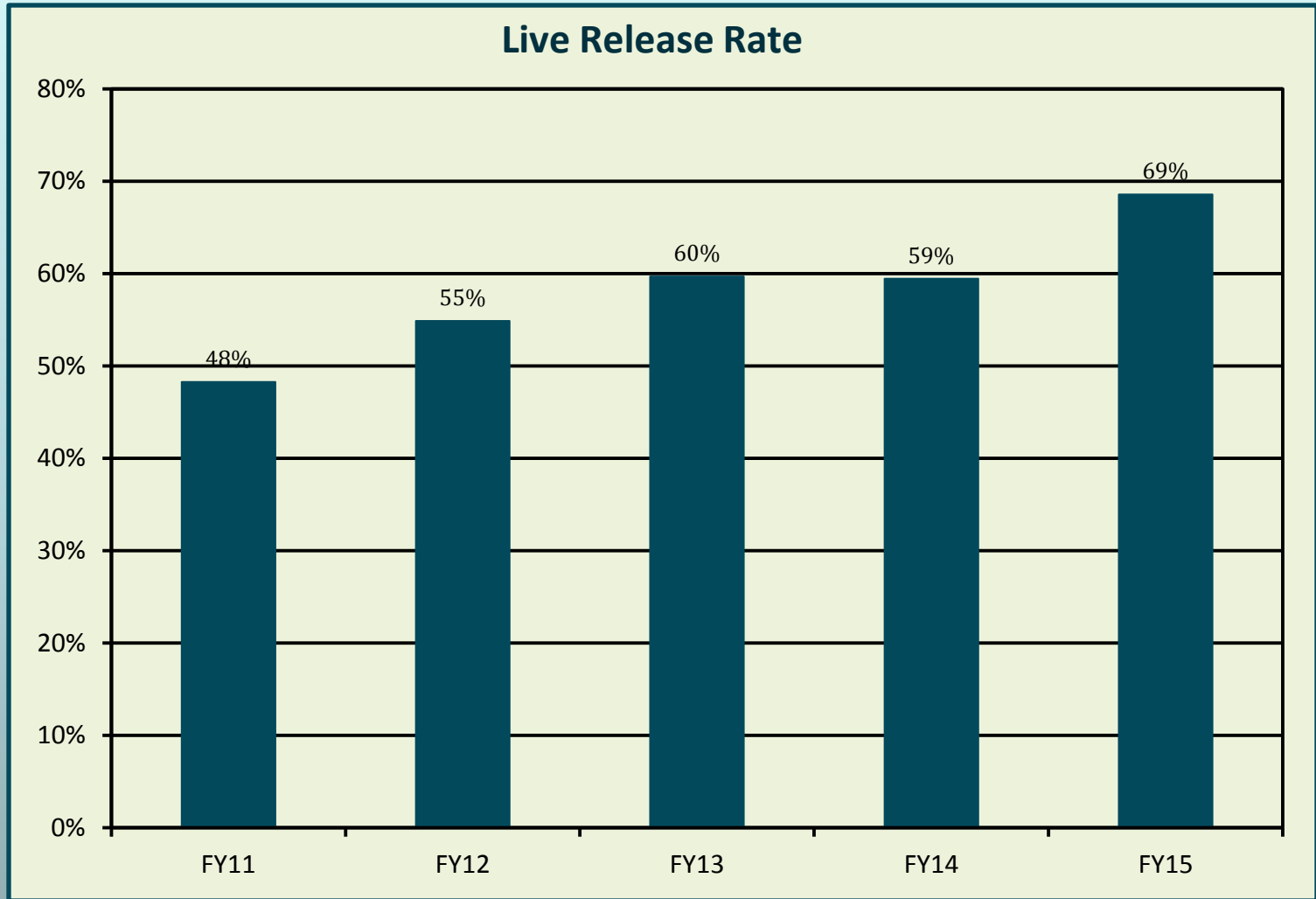

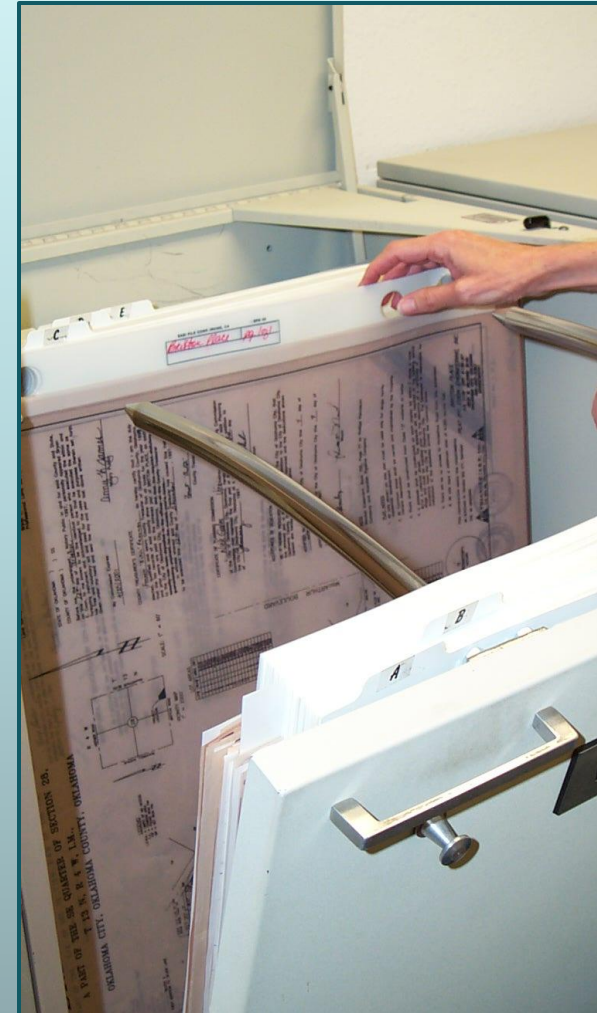
