A Better Way is a groundbreaking employment program launched on Sept. 13 that offers beautification work to people who panhandle. Driving a van, staff from Mental Health Association of Oklahoma will visit panhandling hotspots from 7:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday, Wednesday and Thursday and offer people lunch and a \$65 daily wage for work like litter removal and beautification in parks and other public areas. Participants are assigned to a case manager who will connect them with mental health services, substance abuse treatment, healthcare, housing, transportation and workforce training. Ongoing community support is key to the program's success. Potential employers, service providers or donors can visit okc.gov/abetterway for details.

Schedule your vaccine

Get vaccinated for your health, family and community. COVID-19 vaccines are free and effective at helping protect against severe disease and death from variants of the virus. Schedule your vaccine at VaxOKC.com or call (405) 425-4489. The FDA gave full approval to the Pfizer vaccine though the other two vaccines, Moderna and Johnson & Johnson, have been thoroughly tested to be used under an emergency use authorization. COVID-19 vaccines are also available at Oklahoma City-County Health Department clinics, which are also on Embark bus lines. Appointments are preferred, though walk-ins are welcome.

If you have COVID 19 symptoms, have had close contact with someone with COVID-19 or if your healthcare provider referred you to testing, go to testokc.com to find a COVID-19 testing site near you.

Clear your warrant

If you or someone you know has a warrant for unpaid tickets for a class "a" offense dated on or before December 31, 2019 we have good news. If your citation is eligible and can be paid in full, you can reduce your penalty to a cost similar to a ticket paid on time. You won't be arrested or go to jail. Call (405) 297-3898 to pay your ticket or request a hearing about financial difficulties.

Airport expansion update

The Will Rogers World Airport expansion is almost complete. In September, a terminal expansion project opened adding 135,000 square feet to the airport. It includes a new concourse with four Delta Airlines gates, an observation deck, a new lobby for arrivals, updated security checkpoints and art integrated into the floor and glass wall.

Civic Center makeover

A massive renovation project is underway at the historic Civic Center Music Hall. The Freede Little Theatre will get a new entrance, lobby, bar, restrooms, balcony seating and balcony lobby. The Civic Center's main lobby will also be renovated to include new seating, a bar and café, box office and VIP lounge. The Civic Center will stay open during renovation, which is expected to take 18-24 months. The \$14.1 million project was passed by voters in 2017 as a part of Better Streets, Safer City.

Our Green Home Loan program can help prevent hot, humid summers and cold, wet winters from denting your budget. Qualifying homeowners can get an energy assessment and a loan of up to \$20k with a 3% fixed interest rate, paid back over five years

The Community Action Agency (CAA) helps you determine eligibility, select contractors and ensure proper installation (Additional reviews may be required for properties age 45+).

Replace your: dark-colored roof with a lighter-colored reflective or inefficient heat/ air systems.

Buy and install: Energy star-certified appliances, heat and air systems, heat pumps, hot water heater, windows/exterior doors, additional insulation, solar panels or small-scale wind energy systems and electric vehicle charging equipment.
