



SUBJECT: OCTOBER 2021 SALES AND USE TAX COLLECTIONS

The October remittance is made up primarily of actual collections for the last half of August and estimated collections for the first half of September along with smaller amounts for corrections and reconciling amounts from prior estimates. Combined sales and use taxes for the General Fund are \$10,758,374 or 9.4% above projections for the year.





Sales Tax NAICS Performance

Retail comprises the largest percentage of sales tax collections at around 50%. The largest yearover-year category changes for October were in Retail (up \$2.54 million), Hotels and Restaurants (up \$1.68 million), and Services (up \$1.23 million).



Use Tax NAICS Performance

Retail also comprises the largest percentage of use tax collections. The largest year-over-year category changes for October were in Retail (up \$614 thousand) and Manufacturing and Wholesale (up \$312 thousand).
