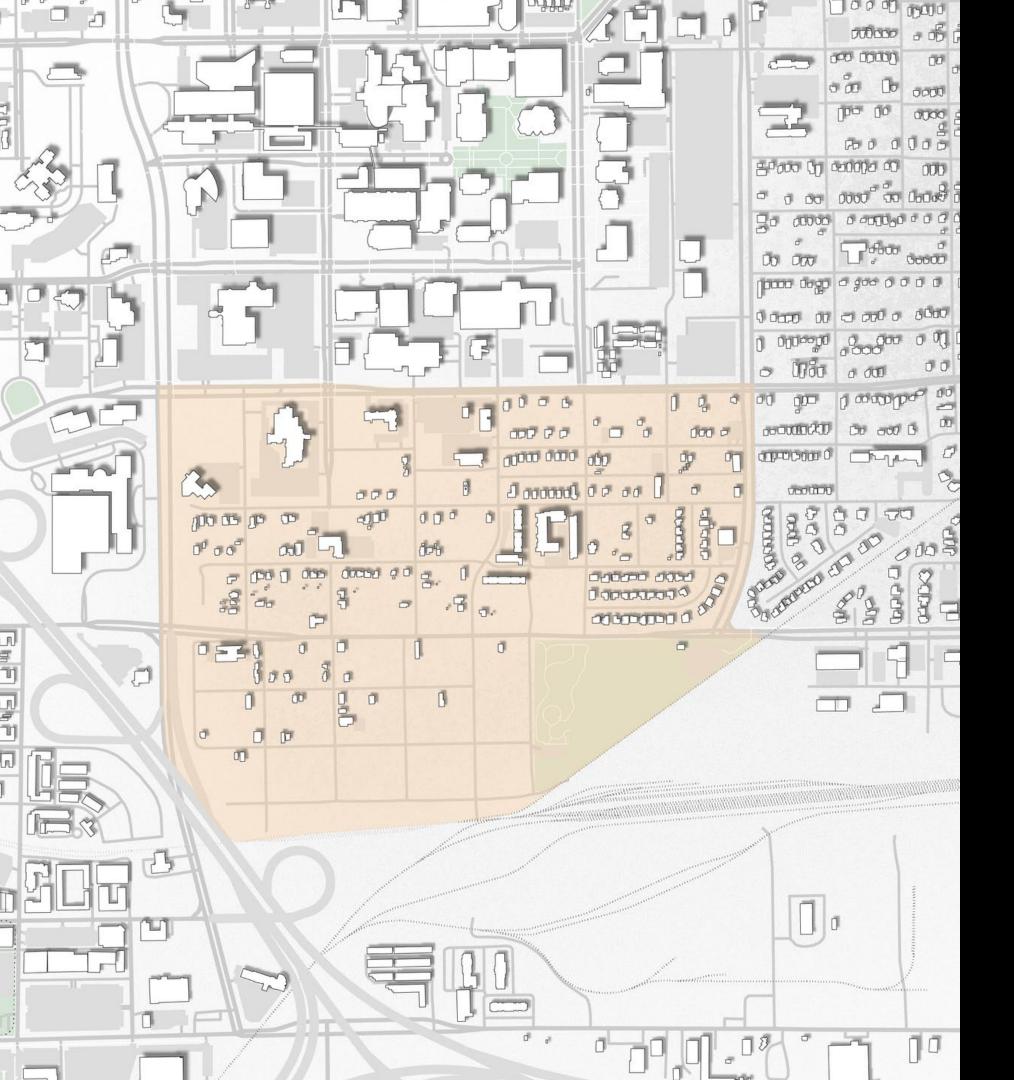

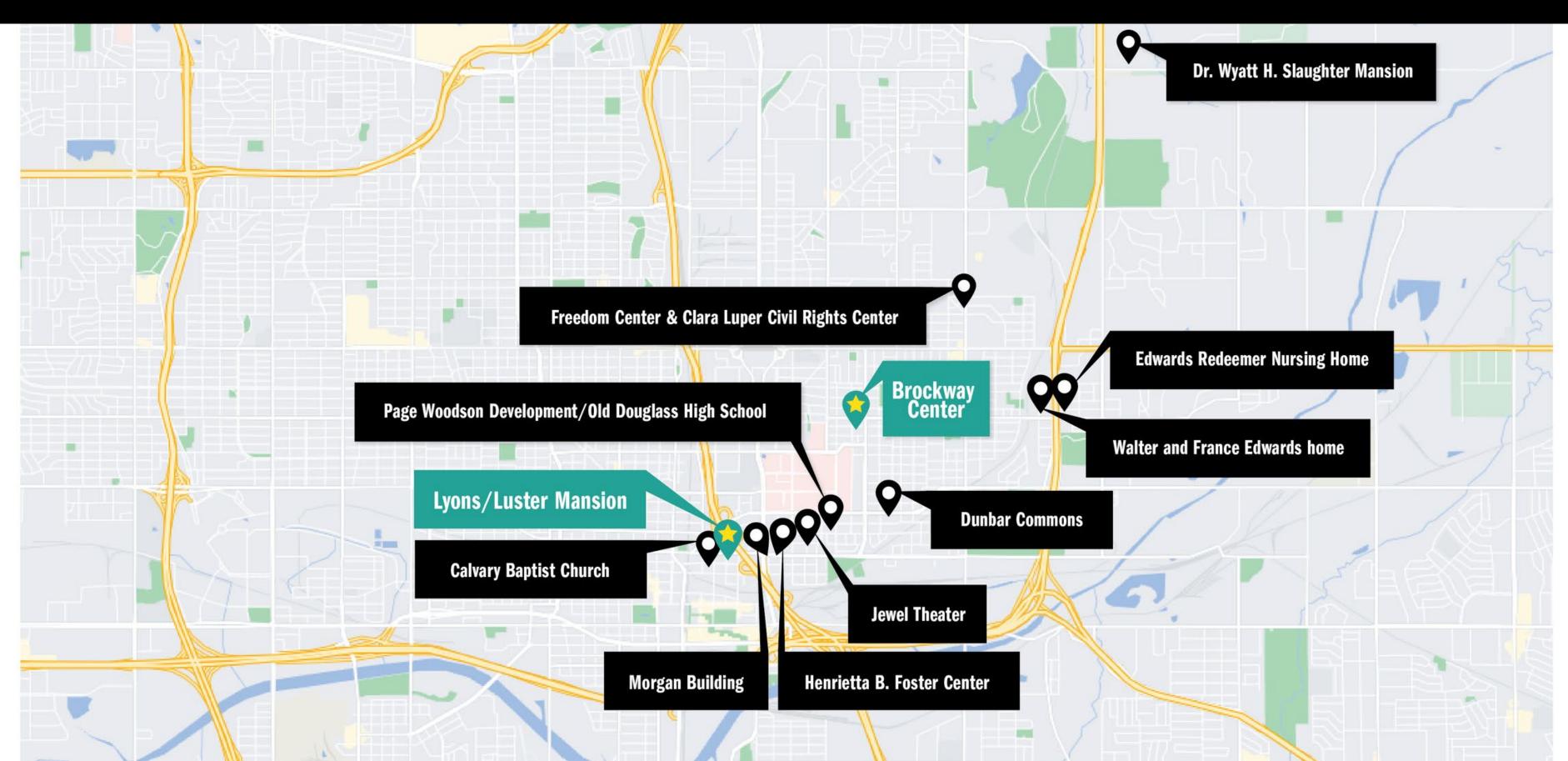
- WHY: OCURA owns 2 of the few standing Black, cultural assets that represent legacies of Black wealth and activism in NE OKC

 Developer is working with existing HOA to determine an appropriate mix and style of units that is acceptable to the HOA and the market



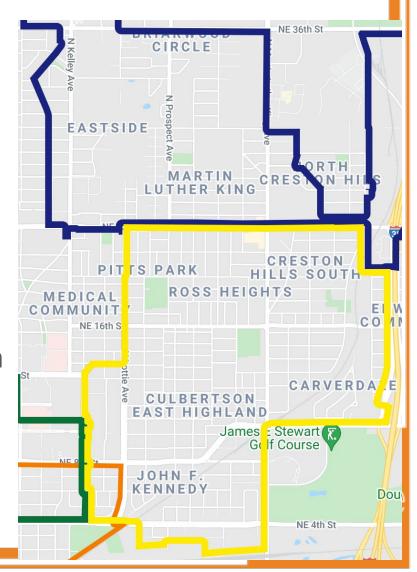

RFPs for Residential Homes

 A Request for Proposals (RFP) is a document that solicits proposals for redevelopment of a particular site.

- Two Residential RFPs available:
 - RFP for Prospective
 Homeowners for the JFK and
 NER Urban Renewal Project Area
 - RFP for Builders and Real Estate Developers for the JFK and NER Urban Renewal Project Areas



OCURA Residential Lots (NE OKC)

- Focus is to increase homeownership
- OCURA lots sell for \$0.60 per square foot
- The average lot size is around 50' x 100' or 7,500 sf
- Home designs must meet OCURA's Northeast Residential Design Standards
