NOTICE OF FUNDING AVAILABILITY FOR OKLAHOMA CITY SOCIAL SERVICES GRANT 2015-2016

Introduction:

The City of Oklahoma City Planning Department Housing and Community Development Division (City) is soliciting proposals from experienced service providers for 2015-16 Social Services Grant funds in an estimated amount of \$121,000 for the provision of social services to the community to be funded from the City's FY 2015-16 General Fund Budget. Grants awarded after July 1, 2015, may be made retroactive to that date. All grant awards are subject to the availability of funds.

Applicants may submit proposals for all or part of the available funding under this solicitation. Submittals may be made electronically during the period starting 1:00 pm May 11, 2015 and ending 5:00 pm May 22, 2015.

A technical assistance/question & answer session will be held <u>for renewal applicants on May 13</u>, 2015 and <u>for new applicants</u> on May 15, 2015. Both meetings will be held from 9:30 am to 10:30 am at the Westtown Resource Center, 1724 NW 4th St. Attendance is recommended for all proposers.

The City will review each proposal in regard to conformance with the guidelines outlined below. This solicitation outlines the type of programs requested and criteria that must be followed by each entity wishing to be considered for funding. Applicants can apply for all or part of the funds available. Social Services funding is for one year. Available funds are drawn on a reimbursement basis.

Applicants will be notified by **May 25, 2015** of the time to answer any questions about their proposal for the Continuum of Care Committee. The Committee will meet on **June 5, 2015** in the Planning Department conference room, 420 W. Main, Suite 900. The Continuum of Care Committee will make recommendations for funding. These recommendations will be presented to the Social Services Committee of the City Council on **June 16, 2015** (Executive Conference Room, 3rd floor, 200 North Walker at 8:00 am) for its recommendations before being presented to the City Council for final approval.

Applicants with projects approved for funding will enter into an Operating Agreement, which will define the requirements of the Social Services program.

Section I. Eligible Applicants:

Applicants **must be private nonprofit (registered 501c3) organizations** and must demonstrate sufficient experience for the proposed activity or project and must have current capacity to administer and carry out this project.

Section II. Program Goals:

Meets an underserved community need

Provides critical services (legal, housing, HMIS, case management, assistance to homeless persons) 95% of the funds must be used within the Oklahoma City limits.

Section III. Available Funding:

\$121,000

Section IV. Proposal Submission:

Each application must be submitted via e-mail by the stated deadline to **jerod.shadid@okc.gov**. The CITY reserves the right to request other project-related information at any time during the proposal review process.

Successful proposals will be required to submit additional documents prior to contract award.
