

Access to open space, flooding/stormwater, nearby retail


Most selected issues of concern over <u>all</u> four survey areas together: downtown, inside the Core, outside the Core, and in rural areas

Most selected issues of concern within urbanized areas of the City: downtown, inside the Core, and outside the Core









Gender: Who took the survey?







Age: Who took the survey?






Race/Ethnicity: Who took the survey?








In your opinion, what are the 5 most important issues **INSIDE THE CORE** as new homes and buildings are constructed and redeveloped?



Most Important Issues: Inside the Core



- Most commonly used word(s):
 "Neighborhoods" and "Sidewalks"
 - Price of high-density development and the needs of lowincome residents and neighborhoods (impacts to consider)
 - Need for developers to have neighborhood buy-in before they build
 - Preservation of neighborhood character / historic ambience
 - Development fitting into the neighborhoods
 - Limiting the impacts of development
 - Businesses buying residential property in neighborhoods without maintaining them
 - Concerns about pricing people out of neighborhoods; need affordable housing
 - Need for sidewalk installation and walkable neighborhoods with mixed zoning

In your opinion, what are the 5 most important issues in areas **OUTSIDE THE CORE** as new homes and buildings are constructed and redeveloped?




Most Important Issues: Outside the Core



- Most commonly used word(s):
 "Neighborhoods" and "Sidewalks"
 - Importance of mixed-use areas
 - Addition of pedestrian areas, safe sidewalks, etc.
 - Size of OKC land area and providing equitable access
 - Need for encouraging investment beyond the Core
 - Need for better road conditions, traffic flow, and maintenance
 - Concerns about density (re: impacts community character, traffic, maintenance)
 - Need for access to open space
 - Need for neighborhood upgrades and more parks and open spaces
 - Neighborhood maintenance of parks/open spaces via HOA or developer
 - Improved runoff and drainage in business and/or residential areas, e.g. Chisholm Creek overflows (Valley Neighborhood), NW OKC, Mustang Creek, etc.


In your opinion, what are the 3 most important issues **IN AND AROUND DOWNTOWN** as new homes and buildings are constructed and redeveloped?



Most Important Issues: In/Around Downtown



- Most commonly used word(s): "Parking" and "People"
 - Downtown viewed as more than a "destination"
 - Want walkable Downtown
 - Need "missing middle housing" Downtown to support business (mixed use)
 - Issues with traffic congestion, roadway conditions, and traffic flow
 - Cost of living Downtown Don't want to push people out
 - Financial incentives needed for more housing and mixed uses
 - Reduced development and impact fees
 - Infill development on vacant lots or surface parking
 - Need street-oriented commercial vs. tall office buildings
 - Workforce/affordable housing and jobs close to Downtown
 - Desire for a Downtown grocery store


In your opinion, what are the 3 most important issues in **RURAL AREAS** as new homes and buildings are constructed and redeveloped?





Most Important Issues: In/Around Rural Areas



- Most commonly used word(s): "Roads" and "Trees"
 - Rural areas remaining rural (no subjected to all the City codes)
 - Losing rural land to smaller lot residential ("too many little communities popping up")
 - Infrastructure needs, e.g. fiber, broadband, drainage, etc.
 - Little commercial development because of limited resources, e.g. sewer
 - Issues with PUDs and SPUDs granted for single family development (creating precedent)
 - Issues with not preserving rural community feel and rural residents losing water
 - Issues with losing wildlife habitat; need for preservation of natural areas
 - Ability of the City to install water and sewer before housing is developed
 - Want more notification of rezoning requests
 - Costs associated with rural development are high
 - Issues with VRBO and Airbnb
