

ORDINANCE NO. 1.

AN ORDINANCE DIVIDING THE VILLAGE OF OKLAHOMA CITY INTO WARDS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CHAIRMAN AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF OKLAHOMA CITY

~~THAT THE PRESENT VILLAGE OF OKLAHOMA CITY IS HEREBY DIVIDED INTO~~  
FOUR WARDS WITH METES AND BOUNDS AS FOLLOWS; TO-WIT.

1ST WARD. THE FIRST WARD SHALL CONSIST OF ALL THAT PORTION LYING EAST OF THE MIDDLE OF ROBINSON STREET AND NORTH OF THE MIDDLE OF THE FIRST ALLEY SOUTH OF MAIN STREET.

2ND. WARD. THE SECOND WARD SHALL CONSIST OF ALL THAT PORTION LYING WEST OF THE MIDDLE OF ROBINSON STREET AND NORTH OF THE MIDDLE OF THE FIRST ALLEY SOUTH OF MAIN STREET.

3RD WARD. THE THIRD WARD SHALL CONSIST OF ALL THAT PORTION LYING WEST OF THE MIDDLE OF ROBINSON STREET AND SOUTH OF THE MIDDLE OF THE FIRST ALLEY SOUTH OF MAIN STREET.

4TH WARD. AND THE FOURTH WARD SHALL CONSIST OF ALL THAT PORTION LYING EAST OF THE MIDDLE OF ROBINSON STREET, AND SOUTH OF THE MIDDLE OF THE FIRST ALLEY SOUTH OF MAIN STREET.

THIS ORDINANCE SHALL BE KNOWN AS ORDINANCE NO. ONE.

July 15<sup>th</sup> 1890 - 90 o'clock A.M.

Board of County Commissioners met pursuant to call-  
journalment. All members of the board present.

Written notice signed by A. B. County Judge was  
brought to the board by deputy sheriff, stating that the petition  
praying for the enjoining of the board of County Commissioners  
from incorporating the N. E. 1/4 Sec 4 - T. 11 - R. 15 west, in the village  
of Oklahoma City had been with drawn by plaintiff George E.  
Dwornik and the temporary restraining order, before granted,  
dissolved by said court.

The matter of incorporating the village of Oklahoma  
City was then taken up, it being certified in the petition praying  
for such incorporation that the signatures therein, represented a  
majority of the taxable inhabitants contained within the limits  
prayed for; and being satisfied that citizens to the number  
of 200 or more resided within said limits of such proposed  
village of Oklahoma City, on motion made seconded and  
carried the prayer of said petition was granted and the in-  
corporation of the village of Oklahoma City was ordered within  
the limits prayed for, and the following trustees were appointed  
residing within said limits, to wit; D. M. Gibbs, S. Frist, Nelson  
Butter, H. Overholser, T. J. Watson to serve and act as such  
until their successors should be elected and qualified as  
set forth in following

within and for said County of Decatur and territory of Oklahoma, met pursuant to adjournment. Present W. P. King & Franklin Springer, J. A. Hartwell County Commissioners and J. L. Martin County Clerk within and for said County.

And thereupon came J. H. Woods who appears for the taxable inhabitants of the towns of Oklahoma City, in said Decatur County in the territory of Oklahoma whose signatures appear upon the petition hereinafter named and for and for said taxable inhabitants presented to said board of County Commissioners the petition of G. H. Mungler, S. K. Hawkins and five hundred and more others which petition is hereto annexed who are taxable inhabitants and residents of the town of Oklahoma City, praying that the south half of the north east quarter of Section No. 7 (33) thirty three in township (12) twelve north range three (3) west and the south east quarter of Section thirty (33) of township twelve (12) north range three (3) west; and the north east quarter of Section four (4) township eleven (11) north range three (3) west of the Indian meridian, all in Decatur County and territory of Oklahoma; And thereupon the said board of County Commissioners proceeded to hear and determine said petition and the said board having examined the said petition and the signatures thereto and the affidavits attached to said petition and having sworn and examined various witnesses who were taxable inhabitants and residents of the said town of Oklahoma City and having heard the arguments of counsel and being fully advised in the premises do find and determine that the averments of said petition are each and all of them true and that a majority of the taxable inhabitants of the proposed village have signed said petition and that inhabitants to the number two hundred and more are actual residents of the territory in said petition described; and the said board of County Commissioners being satisfied that a majority of the taxable inhabitants of the proposed village of Oklahoma City have signed said petition as aforesaid presented to said board and that inhabitants to the number two hundred and more are actual residents of the territory described in said petition, it is therefore by the said County board now ordered and declared that the said proposed village of Oklahoma City be and it hereby is incorporated as prayed for in said petition and that the limits and bounds be and they hereby are designated as follows, commencing at the north east corner of the south half of the north east quarter of Sec. thirty three (33) of township twelve (12) north range three (3) west of Indian Meridian in Decatur County of the territory of Oklahoma and running thence south to the south east corner of the north east quarter of Section four (4) of township eleven (11) north range three (3) west of Indian



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meridian territory of Oklahoma thence west to the south west corner of the north east quarter of said section four (4) thence north to the north west corner of the south half (1/2) of the north east quarter of section thirty three (33) of township twelve (12) as aforesaid thence east to the place of beginning containing four hundred (400) acres of land more or less according to Government survey and which said land is more particularly described as follows: the south half (1/2) of the north east quarter and the south east quarter (1/4) of sec. thirty three township twelve (12) north range three (3) west and the north east quarter of section four (4) township eleven north range three west of Indian meridian all in second County Oklahoma Territory; And it is by the board of County Commissioners of said County further ordered and declared that the corporate name of said village shall be the village of Oklahoma City and the name is hereby declared an incorporated village under the said name and style of the village of Oklahoma City and it is hereby further ordered and declared that from and after this date the inhabitants residing upon said lands herein described shall be a body politic and corporate by the name and style of village of Oklahoma City and they and their successors shall be known in law and have perpetual succession and be sued defend and be defended in all courts of law and equity; contract or be contracted with acquire hold and convey property real and personal; have a common seal which they may change and alter at pleasure; and such other and further powers as may be conferred by law and further may do any and all acts that is lawful for incorporated villages to do under and by virtue of the law of this territory in relation to incorporated villages. And it is further ordered by said board of County Commissioners that W. M. Gibbs, J. M. B. Batten, H. Overholser, J. J. Water be and they hereby are appointed trustees in and for said village of Oklahoma City who shall hold their offices and perform all the duties required of them by law until the election and qualification of their successors in the manner provided by law.
