Area Planning: Windsor

The City of Oklahoma City's recently adopted comprehensive plan, planokc, recommends the creation of small area plans for neighborhoods and districts throughout the community. The Area Planning effort will give City staff a chance to see and understand what's working, what's not working and why in specific areas across the city. This project is part of a broader effort to revitalize Oklahoma City's urban neighborhoods and commercial districts by combining public resources with ongoing private investment. The Area Planning initiative is based on these key principles of livability that were adopted with planokc:

- Develop great places that attract people and catalyze new development and innovation.
- Develop a transportation system that works for everyone.
- Ensure stable, safe, attractive and vibrant neighborhoods.
- Build an urban environment that facilitates a culture of health and wellness.

Stakeholders Needed

As part of the Area Planning process the City is assembling a "Stakeholder Group" of active community members to provide feedback throughout the planning process. City staff estimates that the Stakeholder Group will meet three times over approximately a six-month period. The Windsor Area Plan study area is a roughly 3.9-square mile area centered on the NW 23rd Street commercial corridor. The study area, shown below, includes portions of Wards 2, 3, and 6 and is bounded by I-44 on the east, the OKC-Bethany city limits on the west, NW 16th Street on the south, and NW 36th Street on north.
