- 1. Does this contract also include industrial wastewater related treatment projects or are they handled under a separate contract? The scope of work will be confined to the domestic wastewater system.
- 2. Our firm currently holds an Indefinite Delivery, Indefinite Quantity (IDIQ) contract with the US Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) Tulsa District Office. Under that contract our firm has been tasked in the past and may be tasked in the future with work at Tinker AFB. That work may include designing utilities related to a specific project ie. hangar, building or other improvements. If a utility related design would be part of our USACE Tulsa District contract, would that preclude us from providing a qualification for this contract or would that be handled on a case-by-case basis and determined at that time if a conflict of interest may be present, and that task order would be handled by one of the other Civil Engineering Services Contract Holders instead? There will be no preclusion from Oklahoma City Water Utilities Trust (OCWUT). We cannot address how USACE will evaluate any conflicts of interest with regards to their work. If there is a concern with a potential conflict of interest, this can be discussed between the consultant, USACE, Tinker AFB, and OCWUT.
- 3. It is our understanding that Tinker AFB utilizes a high-pressure fire suppression system on Base which is separate from the potable water system. We would like to confirm if the fire suppression system is also part of this scope of work. OCWUT did not acquire the high-pressure fire suppression system. The fire system is not included in the scope of this work.
