Odd-even watering

OKC's odd-even watering rotation is permanent and has been in place since 2013. It eases the summer-time demand on our water treatment system. Addresses ending in a 0, 2, 4, 6 or 8, can water on any day that ends in an even number. Addresses ending in a 1, 3, 5, 7 or 9 can water on any day ending in an odd number. Most Oklahoma lawns don't need more than 1 inch of water per week in the summer to maintain optimum health. Use a rain gauge to determine how much water your lawn is getting. Fewer, deeper waterings ensure better root health. Visit www.squeezeeverydrop. com for details.

New golf clubhouse opens

Everyone is invited to swing by and see the contemporary new clubhouse that opened in April at James E Stewart Golf Course, 928 Frederick Douglass Circle. The 6,780-square-foot clubhouse features a full-service restaurant, pro shop, men's and women's locker rooms, an extensive patio and art and memorabilia commemorating James E. Stewart's life. The \$3.8 million clubhouse was paid for through the Better Streets, Safer City bond program passed by voters in 2017.

Belle Isle Library reopens

The iconic Midcentury Modern Belle Isle Library, 5501 N Villa Ave., reopened in April after a \$7.8 million renovation and expansion. The library hosts book clubs, STEAM opportunities, presentations and take-home kits. Guests can use a 3D printer, a Cricut and sewing and embroidery machines located in the Maker Space. The renovated two-story building features meeting rooms, study rooms, a teen area, a children's area and a programming room. Improvements were paid for through Better Streets, Safer City Bond Issue passed by voters in 2017 and a generous \$950,000 donation from Gordon and LaVerne Taylor.

New ward map approved

City Council members approved a new ward map in March. The change is the result of a once-in-a-decade requirement to rebalance the population in OKC's eight wards due to population growth. The new ward map is viewable at okc.gov/wardmap.

Fight mosquitoes

Mosquito-borne illnesses are a threat in OKC every spring and summer. The OKC-County Health Department recommends draining standing water on your property so mosquitoes won't breed nearby. Use insect repellent on your clothes and exposed skin to keep mosquitoes away. Staying inside at dusk and dawn also helps because this is when mosquitoes are around the most. Wait 'til 8

If your pet is expecting a litter of puppies or kittens, "Wait 'til 8" can help save their lives by keeping them with their mother for eight weeks. Puppies and kittens are more likely to survive if they stay with their moms for the first six weeks of life, plus an extra two weeks so they've grown enough to be spayed or neutered and placed into a new home. The babies need their mothers' help to learn social skills and avoid infections. After eight weeks, they can be evaluated by the Animal Welfare team, spayed or neutered and placed for adoption. Building Safety Month

Building Safety Month in May is a good reminder storm shelter installations and most home improvement projects need a permit. A building permit is required to install things like storm shelters and safe rooms, decks, patios, fences, driveways, room additions, carports, above and below ground swimming pools. Plumbing, electrical and mechanical work must be performed by a licensed contractor and also requires a permit. For more information, visit okc.gov.

Action Center

People can contact the Action Center to ask questions or report non-emergency code violations like high weeds, abandoned vehicles, front yard parking, junk, dilapidated fences, graffiti, potholes, property maintenance concerns or other neighborhood problems. When you report a code violation, an inspector visits the address to check your complaint. If there's a code violation, a notice to correct the problem is issued. Sometimes a courtesy notice is the first step. Other times a citation is issued. All problems reported to the Action Center are confidential. The City is the complaining party - not you or your neighborhood. You don't have to give us your name or phone number. We request this information so we can contact you with a follow-up, but you're not required to give it to us.
