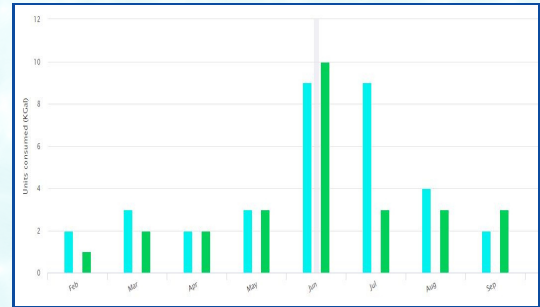


Don't let high bills get you down this summer!

Water use typically rises during the summertime. Check out these tips to help you conserve water and prevent unnecessary high bills.

- Homes with sprinkler systems use about 50% more water during the summer. Find and fix leaks and system issues quickly. Download a free sprinkler checkup guide on SqueezeEveryDrop.com
- Sprinkler systems typically use 15 to 30 gallons per minute. Check your sprinkler system controller schedule for long runtimes, hidden programs and incorrect watering days.
- Most lawns only need about 1 inch of water per week during the summer months. Use a rain gauge or rain sensor and let nature help give your sprinkler system a break on rainy days.
- Both indoor and outdoor leaks can add thousands of gallons to your bill. Regularly check for leaks in outdoor spigots, pool systems and toilets.
