USS OKLAHOMA CITY

USS Oklahoma City Park Association received a green light from City Council to design and construct a commemorative display featuring nautical items from the USS Oklahoma City (SSN-723) submarine and the USS Oklahoma City (CL-91/CG-5/CLG-5) cruiser.

The maritime park will be located on the north shore of Wiley Post Park, 1700 S Robinson Ave. It will feature the sail and diving planes (hydroplanes) from the USS Oklahoma City sub (SSN-723), which served the U.S. Navy from 1988 - 2022 and possibly items such as the screw, anchor and ship's bell from the USS Oklahoma City (CL-91/CG-5/CLG-5) cruiser, which served the Navy from 1944 - 1979.

Narrative panels are planned to tell visitors about each

ship's rich naval history. Funding for the project will be raised privately by the USS Oklahoma City Park Association, led by retired Navy Commander Tucker McHugh, architect Don Beck and retired Rear Admiral and former Under Secretary of the Navy Greg Slavonic. A nonprofit has been established to accept tax-deductible donations to fund the building of this park. How to report fireworks

To keep 911 phone lines clear for people experiencing life-threatening emergencies, the Police and Fire departments ask residents not to call 911 to report illegal fireworks. If you know the address of the people launching fireworks, call the Fireworks Hotline listed at the top of okc.gov. The line will be answered from June 30-July 6. The City will follow up on complaints after the holiday. People should call 911 if someone is injured by a firework or if fireworks cause a fire.

Reminder: It's illegal to buy, sell or use fireworks in OKC. Sparklers, snakes, bottle rockets and all other popular fireworks are included in the ban, which applies to all private and public property in OKC, including parks, lakes and areas along the Oklahoma River.

Project Life smoke alarms

The Fire Department provides free, long-life smoke alarms to OKC homeowners through the Project Life smoke alarm program. The program requires an OKC firefighter to install the alarm. Residents needing new smoke alarms can request them by phone or online in English or Spanish:

- Smoke, not fire, is usually responsible for loss of life in home fires.
- Interconnected alarms are best. When one sounds, they all sound.
- Test your smoke alarms monthly.
- Replace batteries at least once a year, twice a year is even better.
- Replace smoke alarms every 10 years whether they work or not.

Flood info available

Contact the Public Works Department to get flood information from our community's Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM), including whether a property is in a Special Flood Hazard Area (SFHA), which zone, and its base flood elevation. Flood Insurance Studies (FIS), letters of map changes, mandatory flood insurance requirements, floodplain development regulations and standard operating procedures are also available. Copies of FEMA elevation certificates of structures built in the floodplain after April 2013 can also be provided upon request. Call (405) 297-2581 for details.

One new councilperson and three reelected councilpersons took their oath of office to begin new four-year terms at the May 2 City Council meeting. The new councilperson is Ward 5 Councilperson Matt Hinkle. Those reelected include Ward 2 Councilperson James Cooper, Ward 6 Councilperson JoBeth Hamon and Ward 8 Councilperson Mark Stonecipher. The City Council has nine members: the Mayor, who is elected citywide, and one member from each of OKC's eight wards. The Mayor's annual salary is \$24,000, and each Council member's annual salary is \$12,000.

Record airport numbers

Will Rogers World Airport set a record for passenger traffic in March 2023. OKC had 391,389 passengers, which is 22% higher than 2022 and 10.6% higher than the previous record in March 2019. There were also a record 980,188 passengers that flew in and out of OKC from January through March. So far this year, WRWA has outperformed the airport's previous record set in 2019 by 44,845.

Report high grass

Grass and weeds higher than a foot tall and other code violations can be reported to the Action Center. Code inspectors will visit the reported property and mail the owner a notice if grass and weeds are over 12 inches tall. The owner has 10 working days to mow. If an inspector re-checks and it's still in violation, the City will hire a contractor to mow the lawn and charge the property owner.
