







Don't let FOG gobble your Holiday fun!

Toss fats, oils and grease into the trash to help prevent pipe clogs.

Fats, oils, and grease (FOG) can build up inside your pipes over time, creating clogs and backups that can cost you money. To prevent FOG clogs, follow these simple tips:

-  Pour cooking oils, grease, butter, gravies, and fats into an empty can to freeze. Once the can is full, cover it and toss it in the trash.
-  Put all meat scraps and veggie peelings into the trash. Do not put them down the sink.
-  Wipe greasy pots and dishes with a paper towel before washing them.
-  Never pour cooking grease down the sink or in the toilet.

Did you know...

...the amount of water you use in the winter helps to limit your sewer volume charge for the next year? *

That's because winter water consumption most accurately reflects how much is water used indoors where it drains into our wastewater system for treatment.

OKC Utilities averages the amount of water volume charged on your December, January and February bills, then uses that amount to set a cap on your monthly sewer volume charges for the year, starting in April.

It's another great reason to cut back on your lawn-watering when temperatures drop, and to winterize your sprinkler system or swimming pool during the winter months. For more information, **visit okc.gov/utilities**.
