RAPID has arrived!

Oklahoma City's first bus rapid transit service launched Dec. 3, connecting downtown to northwest OKC via Classen Boulevard and Northwest Expressway. A Park & Ride is available at each end of the RAPID NW line.

RAPID vehicles have first-class amenities and advanced technology to help service stay on time. During peak hours, vehicles arrive as often as every 12-15 minutes. Thirty-two raised platforms allow for level boarding and include real-time arrival information, shelter, lighting, and ticket vending machines. Home heat safety

Put a freeze on winter fires with these tips:

- Keep anything that can burn at least three feet away from heating equipment (furnace, fireplace, wood stove, space heaters, etc.).
- · Have a three-foot "kid-free zone" around open fires and space heaters.
- Never use your oven to heat your home.
- Never use heaters to dry clothes or warm blankets.
- · Heating equipment and chimneys should be cleaned and inspected yearly by a qualified professional.
- Turn off portable heaters when you leave the room or go to bed.
- Make sure the fireplace has a sturdy screen to prevent sparks from flying.
- Open the flue when lighting and using the fireplace.

Discrimination assistance

Business Center open

The City's Business Center is open for assistance with building permit submittals, business licenses, garage sale permits, construction inspections and more. Many permits must be submitted electronically. However, we still offer in-person help for people with questions. The Business Center, located on the first floor of 420 W. Main St., is open M-F, 8 a.m. -5 p.m. You can also call (405) 297-2525.

Christmas tree collection

Ready to wrap up the holidays? Set your Christmas tree at the curbside for pick-up with your regular bulky waste. Both real and artificial trees will be collected.

Smaller items like wreaths or garlands should be bagged and put inside your Big Blue Trash Cart or check out local compost haulers and let them re-use your greens. Trees and greenery are not accepted in the City's recycling program and should NOT go in your Big Green recycling cart. Flood info

Do you live in an area with perpetual flooding? The City participates in the Community Rating System, a federal program that offers discounted flood insurance to communities that implement higher floodplain management standards. Homeowners within a floodplain may receive a discount on their current flood insurance premium renewals. For more information, visit okc.gov/departments/public-works/flood-information.

Conservation coffee

At the Oklahoma City Zoo's Safari Gift Shop, you can find Birds & Beans Coffee, which produces tasty beans and supports conservation efforts to end declining bird populations and preserve wild habitats around the world. North American bird populations dropped by about 3 billion since 1970. The OKC Zoo works with the George Miksch Sutton Avian Research Center for multi-year bird survey projects to understand and combat that loss. Next time you visit the Zoo, get a bag of Birds & Beans coffee to aid conservation efforts.
