DIY Sprinkler System Checkup

Spring is the perfect time to check your sprinkler system. Use this checklist to help catch sneaky leaks, broken and misdirected heads or pressure issues so you can help prevent high water bills.

- Set your controller to the correct odd or even watering day based on your address.** Oklahoma City observes year-round odd/even watering measures.
- Reduce your runtimes.** Consider the water needs of the plant material in each of your zones. Bermudagrass lawns typically only need 1" of water per week during July in OKC.
- Remove hidden programs or extra start times.** Check each program and zone to make sure you aren't accidentally watering when you weren't expecting to!
- Do a visual check of the system.** Run each sprinkler zone for 2-3 minutes while you look for leaking or broken heads and valves, high or low pressure, and pooling water. Flag and fix any issues, or turn the system off until repairs can be made.
