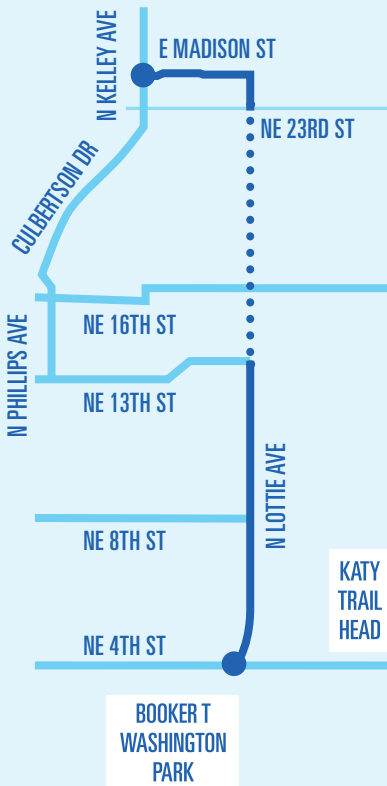


N LOTTIE AVE BIKE LANE PROJECT UNDERWAY

PARKING PROTECTED BIKE LANES

Parking-protected bike lanes are separated from vehicle lanes by parked cars. They increase cyclist and pedestrian safety by reducing conflicts, enhancing visibility and slowing traffic.

FACTS

Bike lanes are part of a larger effort to make OKC streets **SAFER**. Among the hundreds of severe and deadly yearly OKC traffic collisions, **about 80 are pedestrians or cyclists**.



Bike lanes, sidewalks and other safety measures help **REDUCE** severe and deadly collisions.

Deaths among pedestrians and cyclists are **INCREASING**, and are disproportionately **people of color** and **low-income**.

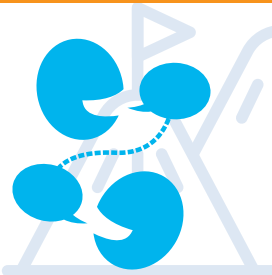
- Community engagement meeting at Amos Memorial Church.
