Are you ODD or EVEN?

In 2013, the City of Oklahoma City implemented a permanent, mandatory **Odd-Even** outdoor watering schedule. The schedule applies to all outdoor irrigation, including in-ground sprinkler systems AND conventional sprinklers. Hand watering is exempt.

- If your house address ends with a 1, 3, 5, 7 or 9, water on ODD-numbered days.
- If your house address ends with a 0, 2, 4, 6 or 8, water on EVEN-numbered days.

Most turfgrasses don't need more than 1" of water per week, so two weekly waterings are sufficient. Two longer soakings is better for root growth than multiple, shorter waterings. Visit **squeezeeverydrop.com** for more outdoor watering tips!
