Therapeutic Riding

Roosevelt Academy's Therapeutic Riding Program at Savannah Station is not just an elective; it's a transformative journey that melds the soul with the spirit of majestic horses. Here, empowerment, healing, and deep connections flourish amidst nature's serenity.

Karate

This traditional Karate class is designed to teach the students self-defense, respect, coordination, and build self-confidence. They will learn self-defense techniques as well as traditional forms all while improving their physical fitness.

Art Therapy

The Roosevelt Academy Creative Art Class is designed to teach students to become creative thinkers and visual problem solvers. Students will be taught the creative process, including brainstorming, creating and evaluating art. Students will work in multiple art mediums including Drawing, Painting, Fiber Arts, Collage, Printmaking, Sculpting, and 3-D Artworks. In addition to lessons on different art techniques, students will also be given the opportunity to do "Student Choice" assignments. During a "Student Choice" assignment, students will create a unique piece of artwork in their choice of any art medium. The purpose of this art class is to expose students to diverse art mediums and to teach students to think creatively.

Photography

Photography is a great way to nurture individual growth and self-expression. Through hands-on learning, students will learn about different forms of photography, photo-editing, and the basic principles of photography. This class is hands-on and will allow students to design a scrapbook portfolio of their work throughout the semester.

Community Outings

Roosevelt Academy's Community Outings program invites students to step beyond the classroom and into the vibrant world around them. These curated outings are more than just trips; they are a bridge to real-world learning, community engagement, and personal growth. By exploring diverse environments and participating in local activities, students gain invaluable insights and develop a deeper understanding of the world they inhabit.

PROGRAMS

CHILD CARE: Starting at Age 3

Roosevelt Family Care & Learning Center Childcare Program at Roosevelt Academy - Embracing Every Child's Potential

Welcome to Roosevelt Family Care & Learning Center, Roosevelt Academy's premier childcare program, dedicated to nurturing the growth and discovery of all children, ages 3 and up, including those with special needs. We believe every child possesses unique strengths and potential, and our inclusive program is designed to foster individual development, creativity, and social skills in a supportive, engaging environment.

PATHFINDERS PROGRAM: K - 12

Roosevelt Pathfinders Program - designed for students in grades K-12 with an emphasis on the development of critical academic and life skills through a collaborative team-based approach. Daily instruction focuses on academics, communication, socialization, daily living skills, leisure skills, vocational training, and self-regulation. To further develop skills across settings, experiences within the community are incorporated through objective-based community outings. Through small group and whole group instruction, students work toward individual goals that will enable them to maximize their potential.

Enrichment Program - is designed for students who benefit from more support in the areas of language arts and math, executive functioning, and social-emotional development. Students receive instruction in two of their core classes (English and math) and then work with the EP teacher in a very structured environment to revisit lessons and take more time to complete assignments to ensure mastery of subject matter.

The Academic Program is designed for students who are at or near grade level but may need support and/or accommodations throughout the school day. They also focus on the development of social skills and executive functioning skills such as organization, classroom independence and self-regulation.

BEYOND BARRIERS: Students Aged 18-22

A transition program based on each student's individual needs, strengths, skills and interests. The program teaches independent living, functional and vocational skills. Program curriculum and activities include caring for self and home, money management, health care and self-advocacy, social skills in the workplace and career/vocational exploration and placement. The goal of the Transition Program is for students to identify, develop, and implement a plan to meet post-high school goals.

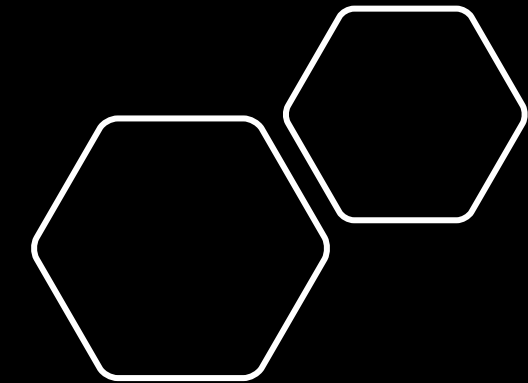

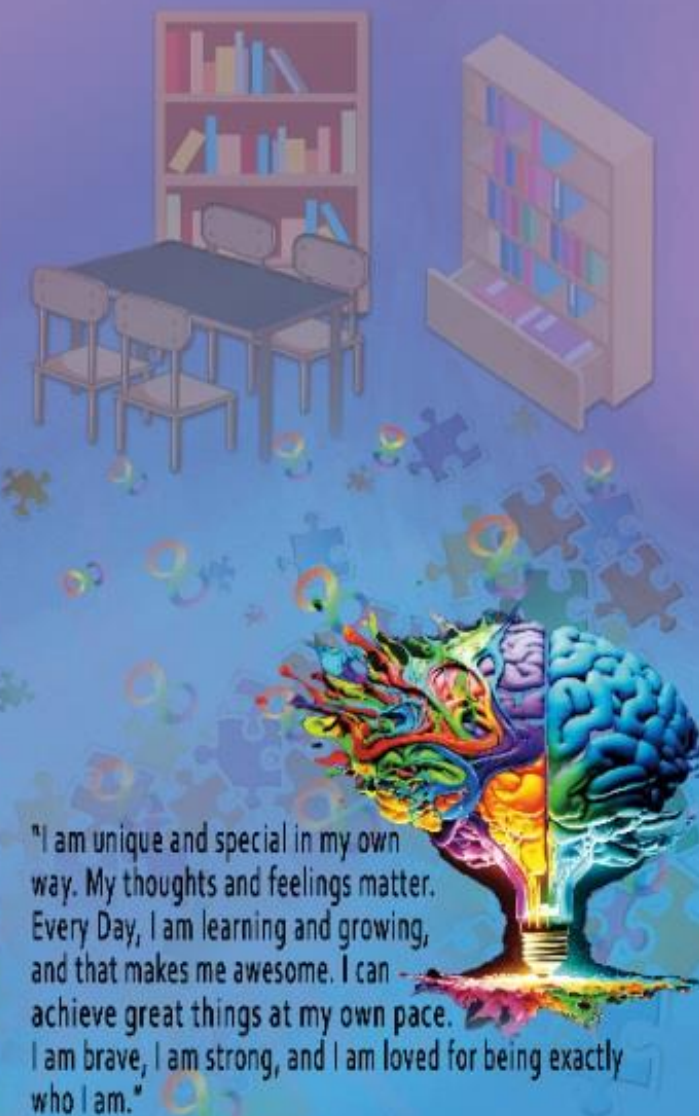

MISSION STATEMENT

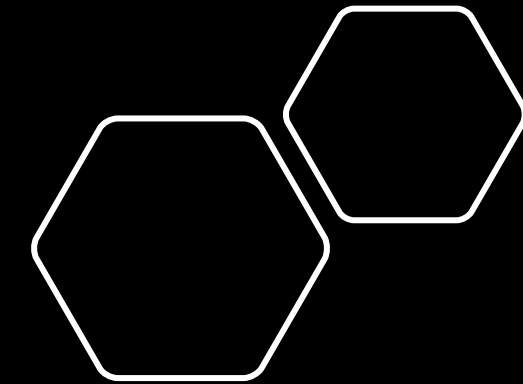
