Heating safety

With increased heating use, fall is a great time to focus on fire safety.

1. Inspect your system

- · Service your furnace for safe, efficient operation.
- · Clean vents and filters to prevent buildup.

2. Maintain your fireplace

- · Clean and inspect your chimney yearly.
- · Use a screen to contain embers.

3. Be cautious with space heaters

- · Keep heaters at least three feet away from flammable items.
- · Always turn off space heaters when leaving the room or going to bed.

Flood info

Contact the Public Works Department to get flood information from our community's Flood Insurance Rate Map, including whether a property is in a Special Flood Hazard Area, which zone, and its base flood elevation. Flood Insurance Studies, letters of map changes, mandatory flood insurance requirements, floodplain development regulations and standard operating procedures are also available. Copies of FEMA elevation certificates of structures built in the floodplain after April 2013 can also be provided upon request. Call (405) 297-2581 for details.

Health kiosks

The Oklahoma City-County Health Department has opened public health kiosks at eight locations in community centers, partner agencies and other public spaces. These kiosks provide FREE access to health items like COVID-19 and flu tests, naloxone, Mylar blankets and more. No income verification is required. In late August, the Oklahoma City Airport Trust revealed the new name for the state's busiest commercial airport: OKC Will Rogers International Airport. The new name was influenced by research on nearly 100 airports, 14 peer airport site visits and, most importantly, valuable community input that recommended adding OKC to the name and continuing the legacy of Will Rogers as its namesake.
