Flag broken, misaligned, or problem sprinkler heads to make it easy for you to find the sprinklers once you turn the system off. Align sprinkler heads that are out of adjustment and fix any issues. Periodically watch for broken sprinkler heads and turn off your system until the problem is repaired.
