

The specific projects for which the proceeds of the aforesaid bonds shall be expended, which may be accomplished through participation with other governmental agencies and others, and which may be accomplished in phases, and the dollar amounts for each project shall be as follows:

1. Purchase public transit buses.	\$14,250,000
2. Bus stop improvements, to include shelters, pedestrian access facilities, sidewalks along transit routes, and technology improvements related to bus stops.	\$4,125,000

The balance of said funds shall be used as follows:

Public transit equipment and improvements, which may also include acquisition of public transit buses and equipment; construction, repair, improvement and acquisition of transit facilities and equipment; bus stop improvements, which may also include shelters, park and ride facilities, pedestrian access facilities and sidewalks along transit routes; transit maintenance equipment, vehicles and materials; related design, construction testing, inspection, project implementation and administration, planning, permitting, engineering, site and right-of-way acquisition, furnishings and equipment, utilities and utility relocation, signage and technology improvements; and, expenses of the bond issue.	\$2,020,000
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PROPOSITION NO. 9

(CENTRAL MAINTENANCE FACILITIES COMPLEX)

Shall The City of Oklahoma City, State of Oklahoma, incur an indebtedness by issuing registered bonds in the sum of Thirteen Million Eighty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$13,085,000) to provide funds for the purpose of expanding, improving, rehabilitating, repairing, constructing, equipping and furnishing the City's Central Maintenance Facilities Complex at SW 15<sup>th</sup> Street and S Portland Avenue, including the City's Primary Data Center and its related citywide data transmission network, and a new City Archives and Records Facility to be located at the Central Maintenance Facilities Complex, along with real property acquisition, to be owned exclusively by said City, to be completed with or without the use of other funds, and levy and collect an annual tax, in addition to all other taxes, upon all the taxable property in said City sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds as it falls due, and also to constitute a sinking fund for the payment of the principal thereof when due, said bonds to bear interest at a rate not to exceed ten percent (10%) per annum, payable semi-annually, and to become due serially within twenty-five years from their date?

Improve and expand the City’s Central Maintenance Facilities Complex, which may also include construction testing, inspection, project implementation and administration, planning, permitting, engineering and design, equipment, real property acquisition, infrastructure, drainage, utilities and utility relocation, roadways, parking, landscaping, irrigation, fencing, demolition, equipment, furnishings, furniture and technology improvements, to wit:

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| 1. | Improve and expand the City’s Central Maintenance Facilities Complex, which may also include grading, paving, sign shop equipment, tire wash and truck scales, storage, a new salt spreader storage facility and technology improvements. | \$4,695,000 |
| 2. | Improve the City’s Primary Data Center located at the Central Maintenance Facilities Complex and its related citywide data transmission network.  | \$3,630,000 |
| 3. | Construct a new City Archives and Records Facility.   | \$3,530,000 |

The balance of said bond funds shall be used as follows:

To provide funds for the purpose of expanding, rehabilitating, repairing, improving, equipping, furnishing and providing technology improvements for the City’s Central Maintenance Facilities Complex and its related citywide data transmission network, including the City’s Primary Data Center and the City Archives and Records Facility, which may also include design, construction testing, inspection, project implementation and administration, planning, permitting, engineering, demolition, real property acquisition, infrastructure, drainage, utilities and utility relocation, furnishing, roadways, paving, parking, landscaping, irrigation, fencing and demolition; and, expenses of the bond issue.	\$1,230,000
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PROPOSITION NO. 10

(DRAINAGE CONTROL SYSTEM)

Shall The City of Oklahoma City, State of Oklahoma, incur an indebtedness by issuing registered bonds in the sum of Sixty-Two Million One Hundred Seventy Thousand Dollars (\$62,170,000) to provide funds for the purpose of improving and equipping the City’s drainage control facilities, also including channel improvements, stormwater detention facilities, and water quality control improvements, drainage maintenance equipment and materials, and drainage mapping, analysis and inventory system improvements, to be owned exclusively by said City, to be completed with or without the use of other funds, and levy and collect an annual tax, in addition to all other taxes, upon all the taxable property in said City sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds as it falls due, and also to constitute a sinking fund for the payment of the principal thereof when due, said bonds to bear interest at a rate not to exceed ten percent (10%) per annum,
