






**PCI** Rating






#### PCI Map








# of miles of street improvements




G.O. Bond Expenditures - Streets






# of miles of trails and sidewalks constructed




# of Riders Per Mon - Fri Service Hour (RPSH) Compared to Average Mon - Fri Passenger Trips per Day

# of Riders Per Mon - Fri Service Hour (RPSH) Compared to Total Mon - Fri Service Hours Provided







Improving the condition of streets is the top priority of our residents and will continue to receive significant investment in the coming years. We are making strides to become more pedestrian and cyclist friendly through better planning, design and construction of complete streets, sidewalks, and trails. There is also a growing interest in improving public transportation within Oklahoma City and the central Oklahoma region. Regional solutions and funding for public transportation are a prerequisite to effectively serve the region and maximize the effectiveness of the system. Attention to new developments in transportation, such as autonomous vehicles, is needed to ensure Oklahoma City is ready to benefit from the coming changes."






# PLAN IMPLEMENTATION bikewalkokc

2017 Bond and Capital Sales Tax will help implement plans, resulting in **miles** of new sidewalks, trails and bicycle facilities.

Facility Types	2017 GO Bond	Sales Tax
Sidewalks	\$18.7M	\$24M
Trails	\$5.1M	\$12M
On-Street Bicycle Facilities	\$3.9M*	\$12M




#### LOCAL COORDINATION

#### EMBARK and other transit agencies

- Work hand-in hand with Public Transportation and Parking Department on projects and grants
  - Currently have shared transportation planning position
- Meet quarterly with Norman, Edmond, and COTPA to future plans and projects





#### REGIONAL COORDINATION

#### Association of Central Oklahoma Governments

- Surface Transportation Block Grant for Urbanized Area program
  - Working with Public Works and other communities to overhaul the funding federal transportation funding distribution system
- Bicycle-Pedestrian Advisory Committee
  - Updates and maintains the regional bicycle and pedestrian system and to serve in a planning and technical advisory capacity to the ITPC
